Question : How much financial provision is needed for the implementation of the first phase of the Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) scheme? Was the overall establishment affected after the implementation of the Scheme? If so, how was it affected?

Asked by : The Honourable CHAN Kwok-keung

Reply : The provision of \$123.2m was approved by the Finance Committee of the Legislative Council in December 1998 for the Government to implement the first phase of the Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) scheme.

As it takes time for members of the public to get used to and be familiar with electronic delivery of public services, the Government does not intend to do away with existing means of public service delivery (e.g. counter services) at the early stage of the implementation of the Scheme. Therefore, the overall establishment of the Government has not been immediately affected by the implementation of the Scheme. However, as the ESD scheme can improve efficiency and streamline operations, providing more efficient and better quality services, we anticipate that the cost of public service delivery can be reduced in the long run. We have undertaken to the Finance Committee of the Legislative Council that the operation of the ESD scheme will be reviewed 3 years after its implementation to see whether the scale of some conventional forms of public service delivery can be reduced and to study the impact of the Scheme on the allocation of internal resources.

Question : The provision for the coming year is \$30.3m (119.8%) higher than the revised estimate for last year, does it include the additional provision for engaging consultancy services for the licensing of third generation mobile services? What are the details of additional provision so required?

Asked by : The Honourable CHAN Kwok-keung

Reply : The increase in provision for Programme (3) Telecommunications under Head 55-Government Secretariat: Information Technology and Broadcasting Bureau for 2001-02 is due to the expenditure required for engaging consultancy services for the licensing of third generation mobile services.

The creation of a non-recurrent commitment of \$55m was approved by the Finance Committee in December last year; it is estimated that the expenditure for 2000-01 was \$8m while that for 2001-02 will be the remaining \$47m. The increase in provision for 2001-02 is due to the fact that the work of the consultant will mainly be undertaken in 2001-02 to meet our objective of issuing licences in mid-2001. As the expenditure of \$8.4m for "International Telecommunication Union TELECOM Asia 2000" held last year was of non-recurrent nature, and \$8m of the expenditure for last year was made to meet consultancy fees, therefore, the actual increase for 2001-02 is \$30.3m.

Question : The Government on one hand co-operates with the Hong Kong Tourist Association to attract overseas film-makers to come to Hong Kong for location shooting and on the other hand cut (relevant) resources, how can we have adequate support to facilitate the location shooting of world-class films in Hong Kong?

Asked by : The Honourable Mrs. Selina CHOW LIANG Shuk-yee

Reply : One of the Government's policy objectives in film services is to enhance Hong Kong's position as a film production centre. Although the estimated expenditure for Programme (1) Broadcasting and Film Services in 2001-02 is 5.2% lower than the revised estimate for 2000-01 (mainly due to a reduction in operating expenses achieved under the Enhanced Productivity Programme), this only refers to the resources of the Government on formulating broadcasting and film services policies, while the actual work of attracting overseas film-makers to come to Hong Kong for location shooting is done by the Film Services Office (FSO) under the Television and Entertainment Licensing Authority. As a matter of fact, the FSO has been adopting various means to attract overseas film-makers to come to Hong Kong for location shooting and to provide necessary assistance. The Government has not cut resources for these tasks. The budget for the FSO in carrying out its work relating to film services in 2001-02, after deducting the estimated provision for the Film Development Fund, is \$10m, which is more or less the same as the revised provision for 2000-01.

Reply : The estimated provision of \$42,934,000 for salaries in 2001-02 represents a decrease of \$998,000 against the revised estimate of \$43,932,000 for 2000-01. The decrease is mainly because the revised estimate covers the salary payment for 5 posts (including Personal Secretary II and Office Assistant posts) which were temporarily created for supporting the staging of the "International Telecommunication Union TELECOM Asia 2000". These posts were deleted after this international telecommunications exhibition cum conference was held in December 2000.

Question : When the Government introduced the first phase of the Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) scheme, the disabled such as the blind and the visually impaired were unable to use the ESD services because their needs have been neglected in the design of the Scheme. In this connection, would the Government tell the Committee :

- (a) whether the aforementioned issue will be reviewed in the further implementation of the Scheme in 2001-02?
- (b) whether additional resources will be allocated to help improve the facilities concerned so as to meet the needs of the disabled?

Asked by : The Honourable SIN Chung-kai

Reply : The Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) Scheme operator has in various aspects considered the needs of the disabled in designing and implementing the Scheme. As regards design, the ESD web site is designed in conformity with international standard, and provides text only version for use by the blind and the visually impaired. The interface and navigation path of the web site have also passed the Bobby Test to ensure its conformity with the internationally recognized "Web Content Accessibility Guidelines". Regarding the provision of facilities, community cyber points have been set up at different locations to provide public computers for the community to obtain free-of-charge ESD services and other information over the Internet. The design of these facilities has already taken into consideration the needs of wheelchair-bound persons. In addition, computers at some community

Question : How many promotional activities were organized under the "IT Hong Kong" campaign in 2000-01? What is the expenditure for the whole campaign?

Reply : The "IT Hong Kong" campaign is co-organized by the Information Technology and Broadcasting Bureau, the Information Technology Services Department and the Home Affairs Department. The campaign includes various promotional activities such as the IT Awareness Programme, "IT Pioneers" scheme, district IT promotional activities and television programmes. The expenditure for the campaign is around \$6.2m.

**IT Awareness Programme**

The objective of the the IT Awareness Programme is to introduce to the public, particularly those who have less opportunity to use IT in their daily lives, basic IT knowledge such as the basic operations of a personal computer, browsing the Internet, sending and receiving electronic mails, etc. The Programme consists of three categories, namely the District IT Awareness Programme (targets of which are housewives, new arrivals and the general public), the IT Awareness Programme for People with Disabilities and the IT Awareness Programme for Senior Citizens. A total of about 17 300 places have been offered by the three categories of IT Awareness Programmes and the breakdown is as follows –

Question : What are the details of the Government's plans to promote wider use of information technology in the community?

Asked by : The Honourable SIN Chung-kai

Reply :

In the coming year, we will continue with promotional activities to encourage the business community, especially small and medium-sized enterprises (SME) to adopt information technology (IT) and develop electronic commerce. Promotional activities planned to be carried out include -

- (a) working with industrial support bodies in organizing seminars for different business sectors to meet their specific needs in developing electronic commerce;
- (b) promoting to the business community the knowledge and application of digital certificates, and introducing the importance and means of ensuring security in electronic transactions;
- (c) producing information material on IT and electronic commerce for distribution free-of-charge; working with industrial support bodies in organizing large-scale exhibitions, and producing booklets to introduce the latest development of electronic commerce to enterprises and members of the public.

At the community level, we have organized a series of promotional activities including seminars, talks, exhibitions, broadcast of publicity materials on television and radio, competitions, production and distribution of promotional CD-ROMs and flyers, etc. to raise public awareness of IT.

Question : To ensure adequate supply of information technology (IT) manpower in Hong Kong, will the Government conduct any study on this subject? If so, when will the study and its report be completed, and how much funding is required?

Asked by : The Honourable SIN Chung-kai

Reply :

The Information Technology and Broadcasting Bureau (ITBB) set up a Task Force on IT Manpower in November 2000 to examine initiatives to increase IT manpower supply. The Task Force is chaired by the Secretary for Information Technology and Broadcasting with members comprising representatives of the IT industry, major chambers of commerce, professional bodies, training and educational institutions.

The preliminary recommendations of the Task Force mainly cover 3 major areas : admission of overseas and Mainland IT professionals, stepping up training of the new generation in their IT capabilities and examining with tertiary institutions the long-term measures to strengthen IT training of tertiary students. The Task Force is now consulting various sectors and bodies, including IT trade organisations, major chambers of commerce and the academia, etc. and expects to provide a report in the third quarter of this year.

- Question : (1) Information Technology and Broadcasting Bureau will initiate programmes in the coming year to encourage the private sector especially small and medium-sized enterprises (SME), to engage in electronic commerce. Please provide details of the programmes as well as the resources and manpower involved.
- (2) How much additional provision is required in 2001-02 for the implementation of the first phase of the Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) scheme? What are the specific uses of the provision?

Asked by : The Honourable Kenneth TING Woo-shou

Reply (1) We will in the coming year continue with our efforts to promote the wide adoption of electronic commerce by the business community, especially SMEs. The estimated expenditure for promotional activities in 2001-02 amounts to about \$6m. The details of expenditure and manpower required for various activities are as follows :

- (a) To work with industrial support bodies in organizing seminars targeting at different business sectors. The expenditure involved is estimated to be \$0.11m, and the co-organization of 6 seminars with the Hong Kong Trade Development Council, Hong Kong Information Technology Federation and Hong Kong Productivity Council will be undertaken by 4 Systems Managers and

Analysts/Programmers of the Information Technology Services Department (ITSD);

- (b) To join hands with the Hong Kong Post Certification Authority in making visits and telephone calls to enhance the knowledge of enterprises and promote the use of digital certificates for conducting secure electronic transactions. The estimated expenditure is \$0.24m and 4 customer services officers of the Hong Kong Post Certification Authority will be required to undertake the work;
- (c) To prepare information materials on information technology (IT) and electronic commerce for distribution free-of-charge; to produce and distribute CD-ROMs and materials on the application of IT specially catering for the needs of individual sectors. The estimated expenditure is \$0.8m and about 4 to 5 Systems Managers and Analysts/Programmers of the ITSD will be required to undertake the work;
- (d) To work with industrial support bodies in organizing large-scale exhibitions and produce leaflets to introduce the latest development of electronic commerce to enterprises and members of the public. The estimated expenditure totals \$4.2m and the work will be undertaken by about 8 Systems Managers and Analysts/Programmers of the ITSD; and
- (e) Other promotional activities include the production of publicity materials for broadcast on television and radio, and the estimated expenditure is \$0.65m. Support from staff of the Information Services Department and ITSD will be required.

The aforesaid work will be undertaken by existing staff and does not involve the creation of new posts.

- (2) The provision of \$123.2m was approved by the Finance Committee of the Legislative Council in December 1998 for the Government to implement the first phase of the ESD scheme. We launched the Internet ESD service in December 2000 and the public kiosk service in January 2001. We have reserved for 2001-02 \$10m from the approved provision for making improvements to the security and monitoring functions of the departmental backend systems which are linked to the ESD system. This will complete the first phase of the Scheme and no additional provision is therefore required. In 2001-02, we will introduce a series of new ESD services, including booking of sports and leisure facilities, online sale of government publications, registration to sit for public examinations, booking of marriage dates and access to real-time traffic video, etc. The funding for these projects will be met by Capital Works Reserve Fund Head 710 Computerization Subhead A007GX New Administrative Computer Systems (Block Allocation).

The findings of our survey showed that the application of information technology (IT) by SMEs had also increased. In 1999, the expenditure of enterprises spent on the Internet exceeded \$800m, representing an increase of over 50% against that in 1998. Moreover, in 1999, more than half of the enterprises interviewed had adopted electronic commerce. Over the past 2 years, electronic commerce has developed rapidly in Hong Kong, and there has been progress in the adoption of IT and electronic commerce by enterprises.

Looking ahead the coming year, we will continue to promote electronic commerce among the SMEs. In 2001-02, we expect that the expenditure on promotional activities in this regard is around \$6m. The items to be included are –

- Reply :
- (a) The FDF was established in 1999. During its early stage of operation, the local film industry was not entirely familiar with the funding criteria. Of the 60 applications received in 1999, only 10 were approved. The remaining 50 applications were rejected because they did not meet the funding criteria, such as the projects serving the interests of individual private companies and not the entire film industry; involving commercial activities and being profit making by nature; overlapping with activities being carried out by other organisations; or involving recurrent expenditures and could not be self financing after a period of time. After a year of operation, the industry had a better understanding of the scope of the FDF and the vetting criteria. As a result, 8 out of the 12 applications received in 2000 were successful.

- (b) When FDF was first set up in 1999, the Government had carried out a series of promotional activities, such as providing briefings for the industry, printing and distributing posters, releasing information on the disbursements of funds as well as issuing letters to encourage the submission of applications from the industry. To enhance the industry's understanding of the FDF, we formulated a series of promotional initiatives in 2000 such as designing a special FDF logo and producing a new Announcement in the Public Interest which will soon be broadcast on the television and screened in cinemas. In addition, we have printed newly designed posters and promotional pamphlets for distribution to film industry organisations to enhance their understanding of the FDF. We hope that these will help encourage the industry to come up with more projects that would be beneficial to the development of the Hong Kong film industry.

We are also constantly reviewing the scope of the FDF. The Projects Vetting Committee of FDF, for example, decided late last year to provide financial assistance for those films which had been invited to participate in or nominated for awards at international film festivals so as to promote local films in overseas market. So far, FDF has already received a total of 6 applications of this nature.

Question : The Administration has stated in the Estimates that it aims to maintain effective monitoring of the publication and public display of obscene and indecent articles and the estimated number of inspections will be doubled to 45 000. Please advise the reason for such a big increase. Is it an indication that activities of this nature are still rampant ? How much was spent last year in combating such activities and what was the result achieved? Also, what is the expenditure in this regard in 2001 ?

Asked by : The Hon. YEUNG Yiu-chung

Reply : In response to the grave concern expressed by the community over the protection of young people from obscene and indecent materials and to meet the public demand for the Television and Entertainment Licensing Authority (TELA) to step up control of such materials, TELA plans to strengthen inspection by setting up additional inspection teams in 2001.

Expenditure on inspection and monitoring of the publication and display of indecent and obscene materials was some \$8.9m last year. A total of 14 617 articles were monitored, 497 articles were referred to the Obscene Articles Tribunal for classification and 229 persons were summonsed for contravening the Control of Obscene and Indecent Articles Ordinance. Apart from carrying out 99 enforcement operations on its own, TELA has also conducted 21 joint operations with the Police and the Customs, resulting in the seizure of some 2 million articles.

The expenditure in inspection and monitoring of obscene and indecent materials will amount to some \$17.5m in 2001.

Reply : The information and statistics on the local film industry which TELA has committed to provide are made available through the web site of the Film Services Office (FSO) under TELA. The web site, officially launched in November 1999, makes available to the film industry as well as the public information on film development and location shooting including an introduction to the Film Development Fund, a location library on choices of sites, regulations relating to location shooting, application procedures, a directory of film industry organisations and a guide to filming in Hong Kong. Funded by the Film Development Fund, the Hong Kong Film Industry Information and Copyright Database to be set up by the Hong Kong, Kowloon and New Territories Motion Picture Industry Association, on the other hand, will provide information on the registered copyright of local films, an image database on the designs of VCDs and DVDs of films and box office receipts of local films. The contents of the two web sites, therefore, will not overlap.

The cost of setting up the FSO web site is approximately \$140,000, mainly used on the design and set up of the site by consultants and purchase of hardware. The annual operating cost of the site is about \$30,000 and is funded by TELA's Film Services provision.
