**LegCo Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services**

**Revision of Judiciary Fees and Charges under  
Criminal Appeal Rules (Cap. 221, sub. leg.)  
Magistrates (Fees) Regulations (Cap. 227, sub. leg.)  
Matrimonial Causes (Fees) Rules (Cap. 179, sub. leg.)**

**PURPOSE**

This paper seeks Members' views on proposals relating to the revision of Judiciary fees and charges, which do not directly affect people's livelihood or general business activities, specified in Criminal Appeal Rules, Magistrates (Fees) Regulations and Matrimonial Causes (Fees) Rules .

**BACKGROUND**

2. Judiciary fees and charges under the above subsidiary legislation are charged in connection with the services provided by the Magistracy and District Court, such as commencement of proceedings, setting down a case for trial, execution of court decisions, provision of transcript or copies of the shorthand notes of the trial, etc. These fees were last revised in 1994.

3. It is Government policy that certain fees should in general be set at levels sufficient to recover the full costs of providing the services. Most

Government fees and charges have been frozen since February 1998 as an exceptional measure to ease the burden on the community at a time of economic setback. The Financial Secretary decided in June 1999 to continue the fee revision moratorium until the year-on-year quarterly GDP growth rate turned firmly positive.

4. In view of the current state of economic recovery, the Administration consulted the LegCo Panel on Financial Affairs on 13 April 2000 on proposals to revise various fees that would not directly affect people's livelihood or general business activities. Taking into account the diverse nature of the fees involved, Members suggested and the LegCo House Committee agreed on 14 April 2000 that the Administration should consult the relevant subject LegCo Panels on whether and if so how the fees under their respective purview should be adjusted.

5. We consulted the then LegCo Panel on Financial Affairs on 15 June 2000 on our proposal to revise, among others, Judiciary fees and charges. Members of the Panel raised no objection to our proposal.

## **THE PROPOSAL**

6. Based on Judiciary latest costing, the existing fees, including the scale of fees charged by various courts/tribunals, can recover about 92% of the costs<sup>(Note)</sup> at 2000-01 prices. *Annex A* provides the cost computation. We

<sup>(Note)</sup> In view of the diverse nature of the services provided by various courts/tribunals and the large number of fee items involved, the Judiciary has since 1989 calculated the cost of its services provided on a global basis. In other words, costs are calculated at the departmental level instead of at the individual service level.

propose to increase the fee levels by 8% in general with a view to achieving full-cost recovery at 2000-01 prices. Details of the existing and proposed fees are set out at *Annex B*.

7. The proposed fee increases are fairly modest, ranging from \$0.5 to \$90 in dollar terms. We do not think that the proposed fee revision would prevent people from pursuing justice.

## **PRODUCTIVITY / EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT MEASURES**

8. The Judiciary is committed to containing the costs incurred in providing services by continuing to implement the Enhanced Productivity Programme and other efficiency improvement measures as appropriate and to review whether it is still necessary to provide various services under the Judiciary's purview that require payment of fees and charges.

## **FINANCIAL IMPLICATION**

9. The fee proposal will generate additional revenue of about \$1.8 million per annum. There are no staffing implications.

**ADVICE SOUGHT**

10. We should be grateful for Members' views on the proposed fee levels. Subject to Member's views, the Secretary for the Treasury will move motion to seek LegCo Members' approval to make the relevant Amendment Rules/Regulation to amend the fees.
