Dear Dr. Hon. Yeung Sum and the Honourable Legislative Councillors,

Triennium Funding (01-02 to 03-04)

I write to express our deep concern on the captioned.

Please note that since the adoption of the one-line-budget & the implementation of budget-cuts in the past years, the Association has received a lot of complaints which is about 2-3 folds of the previous years. These complaints include the "Voluntary" termination scheme, demoting & degrading, early retirement, redundancy lay-offs & etc. Appointees have to work in an environment of uncertainty and under great pressure of insufficient manpower and over-loaded duties. Life-long study becomes a remote and deluxe thing for our colleagues as they have to work early in the mornings and late in the evenings, and in most cases without a dollar of O.T. Promotion to them is a word that cannot be found in their dictionary.

All in all, the morale of appointees in HKU has been driven to a very low level. The strong sense of belonging and the pride of being a HKU member are being worn away by a sense of fear and being insecure. It is worth noting that there are cases that a number of appointees have had chronic diseases such as mental disease or even cancer which might have a bearing on the long period of heavy workload and psychological pressure.

We therefore sincerely urge our Honourable Legislative Councillors not to support any budget cuts in the coming triennium.
