Antiquities and Monuments (Declaration of  
Historical Buildings) (No. 2) Notice 2000

(Made under section 3(1) of the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance  
(Cap. 53) after consultation with the Antiquities Advisory Board  
and with the approval of the Chief Executive)

1. Declaration of historical buildings

The following places are declared to be historical buildings---

(a) the Waglan Lighthouse on Waglan Island, Hong Kong, and the adjacent land, delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked HKM 6436 signed and deposited by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Urban Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance; and

(b) the Tang Lung Chau Lighthouse, commonly known as Kap Sing Lighthouse, and the former light keeper's house on Tang Lung Chau, Kap Shui Mun, Hong Kong, delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked TWM2582a signed and deposited by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Tsuen Wan New Territories Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance.

This Notice declares---
