### **Public Officers Pay Adjustment Bill**

I refer to your letter of 20 June 2002. Our response to the questions raised are set out in the following paragraphs:-

#### (a) Parts 2 and 3

A civil servant is a person employed by the Government on civil service terms of appointment to a civil service rank. There are many different sets of civil service terms of appointment as defined in the Civil Service Regulations. The specific terms of appointment offered to an appointment to the civil service are clearly set out in the letter of offer of appointment and/or the Memorandum on Conditions of Service (MOCS). For persons employed by the Government on terms of appointment other than civil service terms, the letter of offer of appointment clearly stipulates that:

- he/she is not appointed to the civil service on civil service terms and conditions;
- he/she is not a civil servant;
- he/she does not occupy any post on the civil service establishment; and
- he/she is not eligible for posting, promotion or transfer to any post in the civil service.

The recruitment advertisements also make clear whether the advertised vacancy is a civil service vacancy or a non-civil service vacancy. In view of the foregoing, it is clear to both the Government as the employer/appointment authority and all Government employees/appointees whether or not an individual is a civil servant. We do not, therefore, consider it necessary to define the term "civil servant" in the Bill.

#### (b) Clause 5

Clause 5 of the Public Officers Pay Adjustment Bill is intended to cover those public officers who are not civil servants or ICAC officers but whose pay is:

- (a) determined in accordance with or by reference to, directly or indirectly, a point on the civil service pay scales or the ICAC pay scale:
- (b) adjusted in accordance with or by reference to, directly or indirectly, adjustments to the civil service pay scales or the ICAC pay scale; or
- (c) determined and adjusted as mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) respectively.

Essentially, this refers to specified types of non-civil service appointments made by the Government. The remuneration of certain public officers as defined under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap.1) is not determined and/or adjusted in accordance with or by reference to the civil service pay scales or the ICAC pay scale. As such, they will not be caught by clause 5 of the Bill.

In our letter of 10 June 2002, we have provided examples of non-civil service appointments which are covered by clause 5(a), (b) or (c) of the Bill. An updated list is attached. These examples represent the majority of non-civil service appointments made by the Government which will be subject to the pay reduction specified in the Bill. We are, however, unable to provide an exhaustive list of all non-civil service appointments covered by the Bill because bureaux and departments may, depending on operational needs and the availability of resources, make new non-civil service appointments anytime between now and the proposed implementation date of 1 October 2002 for the pay reduction.

#### (c) Clause 9 – Justifications for the provision

Clause 9 is included to ensure that the reduction in pay and allowances as specified in the Bill is authorized despite any possible doubt as to whether the terms of the contract would provide sufficient authority.

#### (d) Clause 9 – Drafting aspect

The purpose of clause 9 is not to interpret the original intention of the contracting parties, but to modify those provisions of the contract dealing with pay, in accordance with the provisions of the Bill. We do not agree that "are to be read as" in this clause implies imputing an intention to the parties that this was what they intended when the contract was first entered into. The effect of clause 9 is only prospective and carries no imputation as to what the parties may or may not have originally intended.

Our intended purpose could be achieved by different forms of drafting. We consider that the present formulation of clause 9 adequately achieves the intended result.

#### (e) Clause 10 and Schedule 3

The arrangement whereby an officer is appointed on starting salaries that are delinked from the annual civil service pay adjustment essentially covers the civil service and ICAC officers. A civil servant or an ICAC officer who is remunerated on starting salaries is remunerated on a civil service pay scale or the ICAC pay scale as the case may be. As such, unless these officers are specifically exempted from the Bill, they will be caught by Clauses 3 and 4 of the Bill and thus be subject to the pay reduction as specified in the Bill. This would be contrary to our policy intention that those officers on starting salaries should not be affected by the service-wide annual civil service pay adjustment.

We have specifically exempt judicial officers from the Bill to avoid any possible misunderstanding that they are caught by Clause 5 of the Bill and are thus subject to the pay reduction as specified in the Bill. This would be contrary to our policy intention.
