Bills

First Reading

Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No.2) Bill 2001

The Bill was read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No.2) Bill 2001

The Secretary for the Treasury moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Inland Revenue (Amendment) Bill 2001

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 31 October 2001 resumed.

Hon James TIEN, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Inland Revenue (Amendment) Bill 2001, addressed the Council on the Report of the Bills Committee on the Bill.

Four Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for the Treasury replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the **Inland Revenue (Amendment) Bill 2001**.

Question that clauses 1 to 4 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for the Treasury reported that

the **Inland Revenue (Amendment) Bill 2001**

had passed through the Committee without amendment. She moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Motions

Proposed resolutions under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance

1. Election Committee (Subscribers and Election Deposit for Nomination) Regulation

The Secretary for Constitutional Affairs moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the Election Committee (Subscribers and Election Deposit for Nomination) Regulation, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 205 of 2001 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 17 October 2001, be amended -

- (a) in section 6(1), by repealing ", notwithstanding those sections,";
- (b) in section 8(3), by repealing "under subsection (2)" and substituting "by the voter under subsection (2) for the same election".

Question on the motion proposed.

Hon IP Kwok-him, Chairman of the Subcommittee formed to study the subsidiary legislation relating to Chief Executive election, spoke on the motion.

Question on the motion put and agreed to.

2. Electoral Affairs Commission (Nominations Advisory Committees (Election Committee)) Regulation

The Secretary for Constitutional Affairs moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the Electoral Affairs Commission (Nominations Advisory Committees (Election Committee)) Regulation, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 208 of 2001 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 17 October 2001, be amended -

- (a) in section 6 -
 - (i) in subsection (13) -
 - (A) by adding "by a Committee" before "may,";
 - (B) by repealing "the Committee concerned" and substituting "that Committee";

(ii) in subsection (16), by adding "by the Chief Electoral Officer" before "on";

(b) in section 8(c), by repealing "any notification" and substituting "any written notification".

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Members' Motions

Proposed resolution under the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance

Hon James TO moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the Fugitive Offenders (Sri Lanka) Order, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 203 of 2001 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 17 October 2001, be repealed.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Conservation policy

Hon CHOY So-yuk moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council urges the Government to formulate a set of comprehensive policies on conservation of the natural environment and the ecology, including:

- (a) setting clear and specific conservation objectives;
- (b) based on the findings of the Hong Kong Biodiversity Survey recently completed by the University of Hong Kong, as well as the relevant data available from government departments, non-governmental organizations and other tertiary institutions, setting up an ecology database expeditiously and establishing a plan and the order of priority for conservation work;
- (c) reviewing and improving the existing legislation and mechanisms relating to conservation, so as to ensure that land of ecological value can be duly protected and managed;
- (d) in view of the public interest, exploring practicable and reasonable options to conserve the ecological environment on privately-owned land, and offering reasonable compensation to or making arrangements for the affected owners to ensure more effective conservation and management of the land concerned;

- (e) increasing the funding for education and research work on conservation in local tertiary institutions, and strengthening the co-operation with such institutions in this regard;
- (f) enhancing the training for personnel engaged in the management and keeping of nature reserves; and
- (g) encouraging discussion and the exchange of views on conservation issues among government departments, green groups, private organizations, village representatives, universities and research institutions and uniting the efforts of the various parties in actively promoting the protection of the ecological environment in Hong Kong, with a view to integrating environmental conservation with urban development and achieving a balance between the two.

While Hon CHOY So-yuk was addressing the Council, the President left the chair at 5:05 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

Question on Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion proposed.

The President's Deputy stated that Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG and Hon LAW Chi-kwong would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG and Hon LAW Chi-kwong spoke respectively on the motion and their amendments.

14 Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon CHOY So-yuk spoke on the amendments.

At 6:51 pm, while Hon CHOY So-yuk was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

The Secretary for the Environment and Food spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG moved the following amendment to Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion:

To add ", taking account of the principle of achieving balanced social development and effective use of social resources, while avoiding hampering the business environment and creating a heavy financial burden on the Government," after "That this Council urges the Government"; to delete "based on the findings of the Hong Kong Biodiversity Survey recently completed by the University of Hong Kong, as well as the relevant data available from government departments, non-governmental organizations and other tertiary institutions," after "(b)"; to delete "increasing the funding for" after (e) and substitute with "encouraging local tertiary institutions

to undertake"; and to delete "in local tertiary institutions" after "education and research work on conservation".

Question on Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG's amendment to Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion proposed and put.

Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 13 were in favour of the amendment, nine against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 23 were present, five were in favour of the amendment and 17 against it. (Voting record in Appendix I.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions being claimed in respect of the remaining motions to be moved to the motion on Conservation policy at this meeting, Rule 47(1)(c) of the Rules of Procedure be suspended so that the President may order that the Council do proceed to each of such divisions immediately after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon LAW Chi-kwong moved the following amendment to Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion:

To add "and strategies" after "(a) setting clear and specific conservation objectives"; to delete "exploring" after "(d) in view of the public interest," and substitute with "formulating and implementing"; to add "which has conservation value" after "practicable and reasonable options to conserve the ecological environment"; and to add "penalizing those who cause wanton destruction of such ecological environment, and strictly prohibiting any developments in the sites designated as of high ecological value;" after "to ensure more effective conservation and management of the land concerned;".

Question on Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment to Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion proposed and put.

Hon LAW Chi-kwong claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, six were in favour of the amendment, nine against it and 10 abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 25 were present, 13 were in favour of the amendment, five against it and six abstained. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon CHOY So-yuk replied.

Question on Hon CHOY So-yuk's motion put and agreed to.

Alleviating the disparity between the rich and the poor

Hon Frederick FUNG moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as Hong Kong's economy remains in the doldrums and the problem of the disparity between the rich and the poor is becoming increasingly serious, this Council urges the Government to comprehensively study the causes of the problem and formulate corresponding social and economic policies so as to improve the livelihood of the poor and narrow the gap between the rich and the poor.

Question on Hon Frederick FUNG's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon WONG Sing-chi would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon WONG Sing-chi moved the following amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion and addressed the Council:

To add "to adopt the recommendation of the United Nations Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights to establish an inter-departmental anti-poverty commission" after "this Council urges the Government"; to add "problem and its" after "to comprehensively study the"; to delete "of the problem" after "causes"; to add "anti-poverty strategies and" after "and formulate"; and to add ", as well as establishing a poverty line or poverty lines," after "corresponding social and economic policies".

Question on Hon WONG Sing-chi's amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion proposed.

18 Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon Frederick FUNG spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for Health and Welfare spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Hon WONG Sing-chi's amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion put.

Hon WONG Sing-chi claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, nine were in favour of the amendment and 15 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 27 were present, 19 were in favour of the amendment, six against it and one abstained. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Frederick FUNG replied.

Question on Hon Frederick FUNG's motion put.

Hon James TIEN claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 16 were in favour of the motion and eight abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 27 were present and 26 were in favour of the motion. (Voting record in Appendix IV.) Since the question was agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was carried.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 28 November 2001 at 2:30 pm.

The Council was adjourned at 10:20 pm.
