Hon SIN Chung-kai, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Travel Agents (Amendment) Bill 2001, addressed the Council on the Report of the Bills Committee on the Bill. After the address, he spoke on the Bill in his personal capacity as a Member.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW declared her interest as the Chairman of Hong Kong Tourism Board and spoke on the Bill.

Another Member spoke on the Bill.

Hon Howard YOUNG declared his interest as a director of a registered travel agency and spoke on the Bill.

One more Member spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Economic Services replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the **Travel** Agents (Amendment) Bill 2001.

Question that clauses 1, 2, 3, 6, 7 and 9 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 4, 5, 8 and 10 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Economic Services moved amendments to the aforesaid clauses and addressed the Committee.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 4, 5, 8 and 10, as amended, stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Economic Services reported that

the Travel Agents (Amendment) Bill 2001

had passed through the Committee with amendments. She moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Motions

Proposed resolution under the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance

The Secretary for Health and Welfare moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that -

(a) the Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) Regulation 2002; and

(b) the Poisons List (Amendment) Regulation 2002,

made by the Pharmacy and Poisons Board on 8 March 2002 be approved.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under the Occupational Safety and Health</u> <u>Ordinance and the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Education and Manpower moved the motion in Appendix I and addressed the Council.

Question on the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon LEE Cheuk-yan and Hon Andrew CHENG would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Andrew CHENG, who is also the Chairman of the Subcommittee on Occupational Safety and Health (Display Screen Equipment) Regulation, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

A Member and Hon LEUNG Fu-wah spoke on the motion and the amendments.

While Hon LEUNG Fu-wah was speaking, the President left the chair at 6:20 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

Another seven Members and Hon James TIEN spoke on the motion and the amendments.

At 7:15 pm, while Hon James TIEN was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

One more Member spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Education and Manpower spoke on the amendments.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan moved the following amendment to the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion:

Resolved that the motion to be moved by the Commissioner for Labour under section 42 of the Occupational Safety and Health Ordinance (Cap.509) at the Legislative Council meeting on 24 April 2002 be amended by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting -

"(a) in section 2, by deleting the definition of "user" and substituting -

""user" (使用者) means an employee who, by reason of the nature of his work, is required to use display screen equipment almost every day and cumulatively for 4 hours or more during a day;";".

Question on Hon LEE Cheuk-yan's amendment to the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion proposed and put.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, six were in favour of the amendment and 19 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 28 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendment and 13 against it. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Andrew CHENG moved the following amendments to the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion as follows:

Resolved that the motion to be moved by the Commissioner for Labour under section 42 of the Occupational Safety and Health Ordinance (Cap. 509) at the Legislative Council meeting on 24 April 2002 be amended -

(a) by adding after paragraph (e) -

"(ea) by adding -

"7A. Periodical break

The person responsible for a workplace shall so far as reasonably practicable ensure that users working on display screen equipment in workstations in the workplace can have periodical breaks or changes of activity so as to reduce their workload with that equipment.";";

- (b) by deleting paragraph (j)(i) and substituting -
 - "(i) in subsection (1), by deleting ", (6) or (7), 5, 6 or 7" and substituting "or (6)(b), 5, 6, 7 or 7A";".

Question on Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments to the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion proposed and put.

Hon Andrew CHENG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, five were in favour of the amendments and 20 against them; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 28 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendments and 13 against them. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendments were negatived.

The Secretary for Education and Manpower replied.

Question on the Secretary for Education and Manpower's motion put and agreed to.

Members' Motions

<u>Safeguarding the reasonable and legitimate rights and interests of employees</u>

Hon LEUNG Fu-wah moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the local economy is in the doldrums, the unemployment problem persists, the labour market is in an imbalance and the situation in which employees are not duly covered by labour protection is deteriorating, this Council urges the Government to adopt active measures to ensure that employees enjoy reasonable and legitimate labour protection.

Question on Hon LEUNG Fu-wah's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Kenneth TING would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Kenneth TING moved the following amendment to Hon LEUNG Fu-wah's motion and addressed the Council:

To delete ", the unemployment problem persists, the labour market is in an imbalance and the situation in which employees are not duly covered by labour protection is deteriorating" after "That, as the local economy is in the doldrums" and substitute with "and companies keep closing down, restructuring and laying off their staff"; and to delete "adopt active measures to ensure" after ", this Council urges the Government to" and substitute with "spare no effort in ensuring".

Question on Hon Kenneth TING's amendment to Hon LEUNG Fu-wah's motion proposed.

16 Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon LEUNG Fu-wah spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for Education and Manpower spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Hon Kenneth TING's amendment to Hon LEUNG Fu-wah's motion put.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendment and 10 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 27 were present, four were in favour of the amendment, 21 against it and one abstained. (Voting record in Appendix IV.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon LEUNG Fu-wah replied.

Question on Hon LEUNG Fu-wah's motion put and agreed to.

The problem of "working poverty"

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the wage level of local low-skilled workers is continuing to decline, thereby aggravating the problem of "working poverty", this Council urges the Government to expeditiously set up an independent commission to work out a minimum wage system and a minimum wage level that suit the local environment, as well as their implementation details, so as to give effect to Article 7 of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights which asks States Parties to the Covenant to ensure the right of workers to receive remuneration which provides all workers, as a minimum, with a decent living for themselves and their families in accordance with the provisions of the Covenant.

Question on the motion proposed.

Dr Hon David CHU spoke on the motion. While he was speaking, the President left the chair at 10:05 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Fred LI, took the chair.

Another eight Members and Hon Audrey EU spoke on the motion.

At 10:51 pm, while Hon Audrey EU was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Five further Members and the Secretary for Education and Manpower spoke on the motion.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan replied.

Question on the motion put.

Hon LAU Chin-shek claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 21 were present, six were in favour of the motion, 13 against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 23 were present, 13 were in favour of the motion, four against it and five abstained. (Voting record in Appendix V.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 8 May 2002 at 2:30 pm.

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ORDINANCE

AND

INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL CLAUSES ORDINANCE

RESOLUTION

(Under section 42 of the Occupational Safety and Health Ordinance (Cap. 509) and section 35 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1))

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (DISPLAY SCREEN EQUIPMENT) REGULATION

- RESOLVED that the Occupational Safety and Health (Display Screen Equipment) Regulation, made by the Commissioner for Labour on 8 November 2000, be approved, subject to the following amendments -
 - (a) in section 2, by deleting the definition of "user" and substituting -
 - ""user" (使用者) means an employee who, by reason of the nature of his work, is required to use display screen equipment for a prolonged period of time almost every day;";

- - (a) provided by a person
 responsible for the workplace
 to be used by users for work;
 - (b) not intended for use by the
 public; and
 - (c) normally used or intended to
 be normally used by users.";
- (c) in section 4 -
 - (i) by deleting subsection (3)(a) to (d) and substituting -
 - "(a) identifying and assessing the risk to the safety and health of users of a workstation;
 - (b) deciding whether existing precautions are adequate; and
 - (c) recording the findings.";
 - (ii) in subsection (4)(a), by deleting
 everything after "to" and substituting
 "believe that there has been a
 significant change in the conditions of
 a previous assessment; or";
 - (iii) in subsection(4)(b), by deleting "變動"

and substituting "改變";

- (iv) in subsection (5) -
 - (A) by adding ", so far as reasonably
 practicable," before "keep";

 - (v) by deleting subsections (6) and (7) and substituting -
 - "(6) The person responsible
 for a workplace shall -
 - (a) upon request by an
 occupational
 safety officer,
 produce for
 inspection any
 record kept and
 retained by him
 under subsection
 (5); or
 - (b) in case he is unable
 to comply with
 paragraph (a),
 deliver a copy of the
 record to the
 officer for
 inspection within
 such period as may be
 specified in a
 request in writing
 sent by the officer.";

- (d) in section 6, by deleting everything after "shall"
 and substituting -
 - ", so far as reasonably practicable, make available to users of a workstation in respect of which a risk assessment has been performed under section 4 a copy of the following documents -
 - (a) a record of the findings of the
 risk assessment; and
 - (b) a record of any action he has taken after the assessment.";
- (e) in section 7 -
 - (i) by deleting "normally used by users";
 - (ii) by deleting ", health and welfare of those
 users" and substituting "and health of
 users of those workstations";
- (f) in section 8 -
 - (i) in subsection (1) -
 - (A) by deleting "(1)" before "An";
 - (B) by adding ", so far as reasonably
 practicable," after "shall";
 - (C) by deleting "adequate" and
 substituting "necessary";
 - (D) by deleting "the workstation
 normally used by the user" and
 substituting "workstations";

- (ii) by deleting subsection (2);
- (g) by deleting section 9 and substituting -

"9. Users to co-operate with responsible person

A user of a workstation in a workplace shall, so far as reasonably practicable -

- (a) conform to any system of work and work practice that the person responsible for the workplace has established in order to comply with the requirements imposed by this Regulation; and
- (b) comply with any risk reduction measure taken as a result of any risk identified in a risk assessment performed under section 4.";
- (h) by renumbering section 10 as section 11;
- (i) by adding -

"10. Effect of workplace code of practice

Without prejudice to section 41 of the Ordinance, in any legal proceedings for an offence under this Regulation, proof that a person contravened or did not contravene a relevant provision of a workplace code of

practice issued under section 40 of the Ordinance in respect of this Regulation may be relied on by any party to the proceedings as tending to establish or negate a matter that is in issue in the proceedings.";

- (j) in section 11 -
 - (i) in subsection (1), by deleting ", (6) or
 (7) " and substituting "or (6)(b)";
 - (ii) in subsection (2), by deleting "section 8(1) or (2)" and substituting "section 8".

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (DISPLAY SCREEN EQUIPMENT) REGULATION

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OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (DISPLAY SCREEN EQUIPMENT) REGULATION

(Made under section 42 of the Occupational Safety and Health Ordinance (Cap. 509) subject to the approval of the Legislative Council)

1. Commencement

This Regulation shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Commissioner for Labour by notice published in the Gazette.

2. Interpretation

In this Regulation, unless the context otherwise requires "display screen equipment" (顯示屏幕設備) means any display screen
which shows letters, numbers, characters or graphics, regardless
of the display process involved;

"user" (使用者) means an employee who normally uses display screen equipment as a significant part of his normal work;

"workstation" (工作間) means an assembly comprising -

- (a) display screen equipment;
- (b) any chair, desk, work surface, printer, document holder or other item peripheral to the display screen equipment; and
- (c) the immediate working environment around the display screen equipment.

3. Application

(1) This Regulation applies to all workplaces in which display

screen equipment is used for or in connection with work.

- (2) This Regulation does not apply to or in relation to the following -
 - (a) display screen equipment that is used mainly to show pictures, television or films;
 - (b) drivers' cabs or control cabs for vehicles or machinery;
 - (c) display screen equipment on board a means of public transport;
 - (d) portable systems not in prolonged use;
 - (e) calculators, cash registers or any equipment having a small data or measurement display required for direct use of the equipment; or
 - (f) window typewriters.

4. Risk assessment

- (1) The person responsible for a workplace shall perform a risk assessment of a workstation in the workplace before it is first used by users.
- (2) For workstations in service in the workplace immediately before the commencement of this Regulation and used by users on or after that commencement, the person responsible for the workplace shall perform a risk assessment of those workstations within 14 days after that commencement.
- (3) For the purpose of complying with subsections (1) and (2), the risk assessment shall consist of a process of -
 - (a) identifying the potential hazards arising from the workin the workstation;

- (b) deciding who might be at risk and how the person is affected;
- (c) evaluating the risks arising from the potential hazards and deciding whether existing precautions are adequate; and
- (d) recording the findings.

(4) If -

- (a) the person responsible for a workplace has reason to suspect that the conditions of a previous assessment may have changed; or
- (b) there has been a significant change in a workstation, the person responsible for the workplace shall review the risk assessment performed in respect of the workstation and revise the record of findings accordingly.
- (5) The person responsible for a workplace shall keep a record of all risk assessments performed by him in respect of a workstation, which shall include all findings recorded or revised under subsections (3)(d) and (4), and shall retain that record for a period of at least 2 years after that workstation ceases to be used by any user.
- (6) Upon request by an occupational safety officer, the person responsible for a workplace shall produce for inspection any record kept and retained by him under subsection (5).
- (7) Upon request in writing by an occupational safety officer, the person responsible for a workplace shall, within such period as may be specified in the request, deliver to the officer a copy of any record kept and retained by him under subsection (5).

5. Reduction of risks

The person responsible for a workplace shall take steps to reduce any risks identified in a risk assessment performed by him under section 4 to the lowest extent as is reasonably practicable.

6. Provision of information

The person responsible for a workplace shall inform users who normally use a workstation in respect of which a risk assessment has been performed under section 4 about the findings of the risk assessment and any action he has taken after the assessment.

7. Requirements for workstation

The person responsible for a workplace shall so far as reasonably practicable ensure that the workstations normally used by users in the workplace are suitable having regard to the safety, health and welfare of those users.

8. Provision of safety and health training

- (1) An employer shall ensure that a user employed by him is provided with adequate safety and health training in the use of the workstation normally used by the user.
- (2) Whenever the organization of a workstation normally used by a user is substantially modified, an employer shall ensure that the user is provided with adequate safety and health training with regard to the workstation as modified.

9. Users to co-operate with responsible person

A user shall conform to any system of work and any work practices that the person responsible for the workplace at which the user is employed has provided or established for the safety and health of users at the workplace.

10. Offences

- (1) A person responsible for a workplace who fails to comply with section 4(1), (2), (4), (5), (6) or (7), 5, 6 or 7 commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine at level 5.
- (2) An employer who fails to comply with section 8(1) or (2) commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine at level 5.
- (3) A user who fails to comply with section 9 commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine at level 3.
- (4) The offences mentioned in subsections (1) and (2) are offences of strict liability.

Explanatory Note

The purpose of this Regulation is to protect the occupational safety and health of employees who normally use workstations (which include display screen equipment such as computer monitors) in their work.

- 2. Section 1 provides for the commencement of the Regulation.
- 3. Section 2 defines certain expressions used in the Regulation.
- 4. Section 3 describes the scope of application of the Regulation.
- 5. Section 4 contains provisions outlining the risk assessment which has to be performed by the person responsible for a workplace.
- 6. Section 5 imposes a duty on the person responsible for a workplace to take steps to reduce any risk identified by him.
- 7. Section 6 imposes a duty on the person responsible for a workplace to inform users of the findings of the risk assessment and the actions he has taken after the assessment.
- 8. Section 7 requires the person responsible for a workplace to ensure that the workstations are suitable having regard to the safety, health and welfare of users.
- 9. Section 8 requires an employer to ensure that a user has been provided with adequate safety and health training.
- 10. Section 9 imposes a duty on a user to avoid risks by conforming to a system of work and work practices provided or established by the person responsible for a workplace.
- 11. Section 10 creates offences for failure to comply with the provisions of the Regulation and sets out the penalties to be imposed on offenders.
