#### Trade policy

Hon Bernard CHAN moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council urges the Government, when arguing the case for free trade in international forums, to:

- (a) support the abolition of trade practices in the European Union, the United States and other developed economies that discriminate against poor workers in such sectors as agriculture and textiles in China and other developing countries; and
- (b) emphasize the importance of market access in alleviating world poverty and inequality.

Question on Hon Bernard CHAN's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon LEE Cheuk-yan would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan moved the following amendment to Hon Bernard CHAN's motion and addressed the Council:

To delete "arguing the case for free trade in international forums" after "That this Council urges the Government, when", and substitute with "participating in discussions on trade policies and negotiations on trade agreements at international meetings"; to delete "and" after "in China and developing countries;"; to delete "market access" after "(b) the importance of", and substitute with emphasize trade"; and to add "; (c) request the World Trade Organization to strengthen its co-operation with the International Labour Organization, and support the incorporation in agreements of provisions for protecting fundamental labour rights; and (d) duly consult Hong Kong people and concern groups through public hearings or other similar means before attending such meetings" after "in alleviating world poverty and inequality".

Question on Hon LEE Cheuk-yan's amendment to Hon Bernard CHAN's motion proposed.

Nine Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon Bernard CHAN spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for Commerce, Industry and Technology spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Hon LEE Cheuk-yan's amendment to Hon Bernard CHAN's motion put.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 19 were present, six were in favour of the amendment, 11 against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 21 were present, 16 were in favour of the amendment, two against it and two abstained. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Bernard CHAN replied.

Question on Hon Bernard CHAN's motion put.

Hon James TO claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 20 were present, 15 were in favour of the motion and five abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 21 were present, 10 were in favour of the motion and 10 abstained. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 8 July 2002 at 3:00 pm.

# RULES OF PROCEDURE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE HONG KONG SPECIAL ADMINISTRATIVE REGION

RESOLVED that the Rules of Procedure of the Legislative Council of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region be amended -

- (a) in Rule 71
  - (i) in subrule (2), by repealing "the election of the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee in the session next following that for which they were elected" and substituting "the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee for the next session are respectively elected in that next session or, in case that election is held before that next session commences, until that commencement";
  - (ii) by adding
    - "(2A) The election of the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee for the first session of a term shall take place at the first meeting of the committee in the session. For the second or each subsequent session of the term, the election may take place at a meeting held before that session commences.";

#### (b)in Rule 75 —

(i) in subrule (2), by repealing "the election of the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee in the session next following that for which they were elected" and substituting "the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee for the next session are respectively elected in that next session or, in case that election is held before that next session commences, until that commencement";

# (ii) by adding —

"(2A) The election of the chairman and deputy chairman of the committee for the first session of a term shall take place at the first meeting of the committee in the session. For the second or each subsequent session of the term, the election may take place at a meeting held before that session commences.";

# (c) by adding -

# "83A. Personal Pecuniary Interest to be Disclosed

In the Council or in any committee or subcommittee, a Member shall not move any motion or amendment relating to a matter in which he has a pecuniary interest, whether direct or indirect, or speak on any such matter, except where he discloses the nature of that interest.";

# (d)in Rule 84 -

- (i) in the heading, by repealing "Personal Pecuniary Interest to be Disclosed" and substituting "Voting or Withdrawal in case of Direct Pecuniary Interest";
- (ii) by repealing subrule (1) and substituting -
  - "(1) In the Council or in any committee or subcommittee, a Member shall not vote upon any question in which he has a direct pecuniary interest except where his interest is in common with the rest of the population of Hong Kong or a sector thereof or his vote is given on a matter of Government policy.

- (1A) In the Council or a committee of the whole Council, a Member shall withdraw when a vote is taken on a question in which he has a direct pecuniary interest except where his interest is in common with the rest of the population of Hong Kong or a sector thereof or his vote is given on a matter of Government policy.";
- (iii) by repealing subrules (2) and (3);
- (iv) in subrule (3A), by repealing "direct pecuniary interest under subrule (1)" and substituting "failure to withdraw as required by subrule (1A)";
- (e) in Rule 85, by repealing "or 84(1), (2) or (3) (Personal Pecuniary Interest to be Disclosed)" and substituting ", 83A (Personal Pecuniary Interest to be Disclosed) or 84(1) or (1A) (Voting or Withdrawal in case of Direct Pecuniary Interest)".
