Question :                      Regarding general departmental expenses, the estimate for 2002-03 is \$4,361,000, representing an increase of 7.7% over the revised estimate for 2001-02. According to the Housing Bureau, this is related to the additional recurrent expenses for the computer system. The Administration is invited to give a detailed breakdown for these expenses.

Reply :                              Computer system recurrent expenses are for general maintenance of individual computer equipment used in the Housing Bureau, which cover fees for maintenance contractors and costs of replacement parts and consumable items. In 2001-02, the estimated amount was \$350,000. In 2002-03, expenses are estimated to increase by about \$190,000 to \$540,000.

The increase in 2002-03 is due mainly to the full-year recurrent cost for the Confidential Mail System (CMS) which was rolled out in August 2001, maintenance cost for two heavy-duty network printers installed in 2001-02 and payable for the first time, and additional provision for replacement parts for about half of our printers which have been in use for more than three years.

The revised estimate for Item 002 - Allowances for 2001-02, at \$1,798,000, is higher than the actual expenditure of \$1,412,000 in 2000-01 mainly because of the need to pay acting allowances to officers on acting appointments and to an officer filling a supernumerary directorate post (D2) for six months. The supernumerary post, which has now lapsed, was created to support the Secretary for Housing on work arising from the Legislative Council Select Committee on Building Problems of Public Housing Units and the Government's review of financial arrangements with the Housing Authority.

The second survey seeks information on the aspirations of Hong Kong residents to live in the Mainland of China and the likely impact on demand for housing in Hong Kong. The results of this survey were released in December 2001. The Government will draw on the findings to update its assessment of cross-boundary housing trends.

Subhead 838 - Minor Consultancy Studies (Block Vote) under Head 150 is designated for engaging consultants to conduct minor housing-related studies and surveys. The maximum expenditure limit for each study or survey is \$800,000.

Please state the targets for 2001-02 which the Administration has said to have met or is on schedule to meet. What are the targets not yet met and what are the clauses?

Reply :

The following targets were set for 2001-02 -

1. Commission a survey of housing aspirations to be conducted by the Planning Department.
2. Continue to fast-track infrastructural projects to tie in with housing developments to meet long-term housing demand.
3. Introduce the Landlord and Tenant (Consolidation) (Amendment) Bill 2001 into the Legislative Council.
4. Complete an overall review of the merits of different subsidised home ownership schemes and loan schemes.
5. Monitor the Housing Authority's efforts to accelerate the allocation of public rental housing to elderly singletons who wish to live by themselves with a view to reducing their average waiting time for allocation to two years by 2005.
6. Explore, in conjunction with the Housing Authority, the feasibility of providing the option of rental subsidy as an alternative to the actual allocation of public rental housing to eligible elderly applicants.
7. Adjust the loan quota for singleton applicants under the Home Starter Loan Scheme in accordance with demand.
8. Discuss with the Housing Authority a rolled forward programme of reducing the production of subsidised home ownership flats, with a consequential increase in the number of home ownership loans to eligible households up to 2007-08.

9. Introduce the Sales Descriptions of Uncompleted Residential Properties Bill into the Legislative Council.

The Housing Bureau has met the first seven targets and is on schedule to meet the eighth. As regards the last one, the Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong introduced a set of voluntary guidelines for property developers on sales descriptions of uncompleted residential properties, which took effect on 1 October 2001. The Housing Bureau has set up a Committee on Sales Descriptions of Uncompleted Residential Properties to monitor the effectiveness of voluntary compliance by property developers. In view of this change of circumstances, the need for legislation will be re-assessed later in 2002. The Legislative Council Panel on Housing has been briefed on these developments.
