Question : When will the study on the desirability of proscribing by statute the offence of misuse of public office be completed?

Asked by: Hon. LAU Wai-hing, Emily

Reply: The ICAC has undertaken a comprehensive research into the desirability of codifying the common law offence of misconduct in public office. The research, which included examination of legislation of over 20 jurisdictions having similar offence on statute, was completed in June 2001 and a detailed report recommending codification was forwarded to the Administration after it was endorsed by the Operations Review Committee and the Advisory Committee on Corruption. An inter-departmental working group comprising representatives of the Administration Wing, Civil Service Bureau, Department of Justice and the ICAC is examining the ICAC proposal.

Reply: Subhead 204 “Investigation Expenses” is an essential source of investigation funding for the purpose of evidence gathering and procurement of other support services required for both overt and covert cases. The relevant records contain operational information of a confidential nature. It is therefore inappropriate to provide a breakdown of the expenses in the format requested.

The provision under Subhead 204 is mainly for overseas investigation expenses; charges levied by bodies such as banks, clearing houses, share registrars and similar government and non-government bodies for information; documents and services supplied to the ICAC in connection with investigations and enquiries; fees for professional services (e.g. accountancy and surveying services); and other minor expenses incurred during investigations. The expenditures for the past two years are as follows –
