**United Nations Sanctions (Afghanistan)  
(Amendment) Regulation 2002 (L.N. 134 of 2002)**

**United Nations Sanctions**  
**(Afghanistan)(Amendment) Regulation 2002**

Your letter of 3 December 2002 refers.

Our replies to your questions are as follows:

- (a) As the United Nations Sanctions Ordinance has been effective in implementing the Central People's Government's instructions with regard to the imposition of sanctions against places outside the People's Republic of China in accordance with UN Security Council Resolutions (UNSCR)s, we consider that there is no pressing need to amend the Ordinance.
- (b) As stated in my letter of 26 November 2002, we are prepared to remove provisions in connection with the prohibition on supplying funds and arms to the relevant persons and undertakings as defined under the existing UN Sanctions (Afghanistan) Regulation to address the problem of overlap with the Anti-Terrorism Ordinance. We will consult the Department of Justice regarding the details of the amendments to be introduced.
