

**Follow-up to LegCo Manpower Panel meeting on 2 November 2001
Information Technology (IT) Assistant Courses**

Purpose

This paper presents the basis for determining the number of training places in the IT Assistant Courses and the job vacancies recorded by the Labour Department in respect of IT vacancies as requested by the Manpower Panel.

Administration's response

2. The pilot ITAT course was run by the Vocational Training Council from February to May in 2000. There was an encouraging response as over 3,200 applicants competed for the 300 places offered. With the growth potential of the IT industry, we foresaw a need to train additional qualified IT assistants. The expansion of the training capacity to 1,000 for each of the following two years (2000/01 and 2001/02) took into consideration the demand for IT training as reflected by the number of applications for the pilot course. We will monitor the demand for training places under the programme.

3. The number of vacancies for IT posts registered with the Labour Department from January to October 2001 was 2 583. The breakdown by job title is as follows:
