

Police will not tolerate corruption activities

Commenting on the arrests of three Police officers by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC), a Police spokesman said today (May 18) that Police will not tolerate any corruption activities and will fully support the ICAC investigation.

The spokesman noted that the total number of corruption reports involving Police officers has dropped 14.8 per cent from 602 cases in 2000 to 513 cases in 2001 as compared to 4 390 and 4 476 corruption reports received by the ICAC in 2000 and 2001 respectively.

A total of 107 cases involving Police officers have been reported in the first three months of this year as compared to an overall 1 047 reports received by the ICAC.

"The Force has taken the initiative in the fight against corruption and has developed a strategy to promote a corruption free working environment for members of the Force," the spokesman added.
