The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Foreshore, Sea-bed and Roads (Amendment) Bill 2003

The Secretary for the Environment, Transport and Works moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Bills of Exchange (Amendment) Bill 2003

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule $54\,(4)$ of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Education Reorganization (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2002

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 20 November 2002 resumed.

Hon Cyd HO, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Education Reorganization (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2002, addressed the Council on the Report of the Bills Committee on the Bill. After the address, she spoke on the Bill in her personal capacity as a Member.

Another Member spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Education and Manpower replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the **Education** Reorganization (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2002.

Question that clauses 2 to 42 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 1 and 43 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Education and Manpower moved amendments to the aforesaid clauses and addressed the Committee. Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 1 and 43, as amended, stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that the schedule stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Education and Manpower reported that

the Education Reorganization (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2002

had passed through the Committee with amendments. He moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Motions

<u>Proposed resolution under the Security and Guarding Services</u> Ordinance

The Secretary for Security moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That the notice, as annexed to this Motion, which specifies the revised criteria that a person must satisfy before the Commissioner of Police may, under the Security and Guarding Services Ordinance, issue to him a permit to do security work, be approved. (Contents of the notice as annexed to the Motion in Appendix I.)

Question on the motion proposed.

Hon Miriam LAU declared interest as the chairman of Security and Guarding Services Industry Authority and spoke on the motion.

Another three Members spoke on the motion.

The Secretary for Security replied.

Question on the motion put and agreed to.

Members' Motions

The 2003-04 Budget

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council demands the Government, when formulating the 2003-04 Budget, not to raise tuition fees, not to increase the government fees and charges that affect people's livelihood, not to cut spending across the board on government services, and not to introduce tax increases targeted at the middle class.

Question on Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung and Hon Miriam LAU would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung spoke on the motion and the amendments.

While Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung was speaking, the President left the chair at 6:01 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

Hon Miriam LAU spoke on the motion and the amendments.

10 Members and Hon LEE Cheuk-yan spoke on the motion and the amendments.

At 7:15 pm, while Hon LEE Cheuk-yan was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Another 17 Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung moved the following amendment to Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion:

To add "to take account not only of the need to tackle the huge deficits, but also of the hardships faced by the public, and" after "That this Council demands the Government, when formulating the 2003-04 Budget,"; to add "not to reduce the rates of the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance across the board," after "not to cut spending across the board on government services,"; and to add "the grass roots and" after "and not to introduce tax increases targeted at".

Question on Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung's amendment to Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

The President stated that as Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung's amendment had been passed, she granted leave for Hon Miriam LAU to revise the terms of her amendment.

Hon Miriam LAU moved the following revised amendment to Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion as amended by Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung and explained the revised wording of her amendment to the Council:

To add ", as well as not to increase the government fees and charges that affect the business environment, not to abolish the concessionary duty rate for ultra low sulphur diesel and not to increase the duty on petrol" after "not to introduce tax increases targeted at the grass roots and the middle class".

Question on Hon Miriam LAU's amendment to Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion as amended by Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung proposed, put and agreed to.

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum replied.

Question on Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's motion, as amended by Hon YEUNG Yiu-chung and Hon Miriam LAU, put and agreed to.

Public consultation on constitutional reforms

Hon Emily LAU moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the Executive Authorities have undertaken in the Policy Agenda to begin to make suitable preparations for the review of constitutional developments after 2007, this Council urges the Administration to conduct as soon as possible a public consultation on constitutional reforms.

Question on Hon Emily LAU's motion proposed.

The President stated that Dr Hon Philip WONG would move an amendment to the motion and that Hon LAU Ping-cheung would also move an amendment to Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion, the amendment, and the amendment to the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Dr Hon Philip WONG moved the following amendment to Hon Emily LAU's motion and addressed the Council:

To delete "a" after "this Council urges the Administration to conduct as soon as possible" and substitute with "research concerning constitutional developments and thereafter to commence"; and to delete "on constitutional reforms" after "public consultation" and substitute with "at an appropriate time".

Question on Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment to Hon Emily LAU's motion proposed.

Hon LAU Ping-cheung moved the following amendment to Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment and addressed the Council:

To delete "commerce" after "this Council urges the Administration to conduct as soon as possible research concerning constitutional developments and thereafter to" and substitute with "conduct"; and to delete "at an appropriate time" after "public consultation" and substitute with "after the 2004 Legislative Council elections".

Question on Hon LAU Ping-cheung's amendment to Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment proposed.

18 Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Emily LAU spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Constitutional Affairs spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Question on Hon LAU Ping-cheung's amendment to Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment put.

Hon Emily LAU claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 13 were in favour of the amendment and 11 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 29 were present, 11 were in favour of the amendment and 17 against it. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that Hon LAU Ping-cheung's amendment was negatived.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions being claimed in respect of the remaining motions to be moved to the motion on Public consultation on constitutional reforms at this meeting, Rule 47(1)(c) of the Rules of Procedure be suspended so that the President may order that the Council do proceed to each of such divisions immediately after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Question on Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment put.

Hon LAU Chin-shek claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 13 were in favour of the amendment, four against it and seven abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 29 were present, 11 were in favour of the amendment and 17 against it. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that Dr Hon Philip WONG's amendment was negatived.

Hon Emily LAU replied.

Question on Hon Emily LAU's motion put.

Hon Emily LAU claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 23 were present, four were in favour of the motion, seven against it and 12 abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 28 were present, 17 were in favour of the motion, one against it and nine abstained. (Voting record in Appendix IV.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 26 February 2003 at 2:30 pm.

The Council was adjourned at 12:10 am on 20 February 2003.

SECURITY AND GUARDING SERVICES ORDINANCE (Chapter 460) (Notice under section 6(1)(b)(i))

CRITERIA FOR ISSUING A SECURITY PERSONNEL PERMIT

Take notice that, pursuant to section 6(1)(b)(i) of the Security and Guarding Services Ordinance, the Security and Guarding Services Industry Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Authority") hereby specifies the following revised criteria (hereafter referred to as "the revised criteria"), which replace the ones published in G.N. 2994 on 4 August 1995 with effect from 1 April 2003, for issuing a permit under the said Ordinance. The criteria specified below in relation to a particular type of security work must be satisfied by a person before the Commissioner of Police may issue to him a permit under the said Ordinance to do that type of security work.

- (A) Guarding work restricted to a "single private residential building", the performance of which does not require the carrying of arms and ammunition (See Note 1)
- (a) Age

- (i) The applicant must be 18 years of age and above on the date of application.
- (ii) If the applicant or permit holder is 65 years of age or above, he/she must produce a medical certificate (see Note 2) issued by a registered medical practitioner to certify that he/she is fit to undertake the duties required every two years.

(b) Fitness

The applicant must be physically fit to perform the job. A medical certificate (see Note 2) issued by a registered medical practitioner may be required if the Commissioner of Police reasonably considers necessary.

(c) Good Character

The applicant must be of good character having regard to his employment history, criminal records (see Note 3) and other relevant factors.

- (d) Proficiency in Security The applicant must satisfy one of the Work followings:
 - (i) He/She must have sat and passed a trade test recognized by the Authority and announced in a manner that it thinks fit, within 1 year before submitting his/her application. (A person who has already passed a recognized trade test before the commencement of the revised criteria is eligible to apply for a permit within 1 year from the effective date of the revised criteria.); or
 - (ii) He/She must have not less than 3 years of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 5 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
 - (iii) He/She must have not less than 1 year of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 2 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
 - (iv) He/She must produce a letter of employment from the prospective employer (see Note 5).
- (B) Guarding work in respect of any persons, premises or properties, the performance of which does not require the carrying of arms and ammunition and which does not fall within Category A
- (a) Age The applicant must be 18 years of age or above. The upper age limit for engaging in this type of security work is 65 years.
- (b) Fitness

 The applicant must be physically fit to perform the job. A medical certificate (see Note 2) issued by a registered medical practitioner may be required if the Commissioner of Police

reasonably considers necessary.

(c) Good Character

The applicant must be of good character having regard to his employment history, criminal records (see Note 3) and other relevant factors.

(d) Proficiency in Security
Work

The applicant must satisfy one of the followings:

- (i) He/She must have sat and passed a trade test recognized by the Authority and announced in a manner that it thinks fit, within 1 year before submitting his/her application. (A person who has already passed a recognized trade test before the commencement of the revised criteria is eligible to apply for a permit within 1 year from the effective date of the revised criteria.); or
- (ii) He/She must have not less than 3 years of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 5 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
- (iii) He/She must have not less than 1 year of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 2 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
- (iv) He/She must produce a letter of employment from the prospective employer (see Note 5).

(C) Guarding work, the performance of which requires the carrying of arms and ammunition

(a) Age

The applicant must be 18 years of age or above. The upper age limit for engaging in this type of security work is 55 years.

(b) Fitness

The applicant must be physically fit to perform the job. A medical certificate (see Note 2) issued by a registered medical practitioner may be required if the Commissioner of Police reasonably considers necessary.

(c) Good Character

The applicant must be of good character having regard to his employment history, criminal records (see Note 3) and other relevant factors.

(d) Proficiency in Security Work

The applicant must satisfy one of the followings:

- (i) He/She must have sat and passed a trade test recognized by the Authority and announced in a manner that it thinks fit, within 1 year before submitting his/her application. (A person who has already passed a recognised trade test before the commencement of the revised criteria is eligible to apply for a permit within 1 year from the effective date of the revised criteria.); or
- (ii) He/She must have not less than 3 years of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 5 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
- (iii) He/She must have not less than 1 year of cumulative working experience in performing security work lawfully in Hong Kong over the past 2 years immediately before submitting his/her application (Note 4); or
- (iv) He/She must produce a letter of employment from the prospective employer (see Note 5).

(e) Arms Licence

The applicant must possess a valid arms licence for the arms used on duty issued by the Commissioner of Police.

Installation, maintenance and/or repairing of a security device **(D)** and/or designing (for any particular premises or place) a system incorporating a security device

The applicant must be 18 years of age or above. (a) Age

(b) Proficiency The applicant shall have received appropriate

> training or can demonstrate the capability and proficiency (see Note 6) in the skills/technique

required in performing his/her job.

(c) Good Character The applicant must be of good character having

> regard to his employment history, criminal records (see Note 3) and other relevant factors.

(d) Certification of On his/her first application for a permit, the Employment by applicant must produce a letter of employment

Prospective Employer

from the prospective employer.

Notes

- (1) A single private residential building means an independent* structure -
 - (a) covered by a roof and enclosed by walls extending from the foundation to the roof,
 - (b) used substantially for private residential purpose; and
 - (c) with only one main access point⁺.
 - A building is considered to be independent from another if on most of the floors, one cannot get access to the quarters on the same floor in the other building without going to an upper/lower floor, roof or the street.
 - 'Main access point' means the entrance gate or lift lobby or staircase commonly used by residents to gain access to their flats. This excludes emergency and fire exit.
- (2) A standard medical certificate form is available from the Licensing Office of the Hong Kong Police Force.
- (3) The Commissioner of Police shall consider the nature of the criminal offence committed by the applicant and may refer the application to the Security and Guarding Services Industry Authority for decision under section 14(5)(b) of the Security and Guarding Services Ordinance. No person will normally be granted a permit if he/she -
 - (a) was convicted of any offence specified in column 2 of Schedule 2 to the Security and Guarding Services Ordinance and the penalty imposed on him/her for that offence is the corresponding penalty specified in column 3 of that Schedule, within 5 years before submitting his/her application; or
 - (b) is currently on probation, bound over, remission or suspended sentence; or
 - (c) is within 3 years of release from a term of imprisonment; or
 - (d) was convicted of 3 or more offences within 5 years before submitting his/her

application. Offences involving fixed penalty tickets, traffic summons, illegal hawking, article obstruction, littering, jaywalking and failing to answer Police or Court bail are considered minor and will be excluded.

- (4) Working experience may be substantiated by relevant documentary evidence provided by employers or a statutory declaration of experience by the applicant.
- (5) Item (iv) will cease to have effect 12 months after the effective date of the revised criteria as published in the Gazette.
- (6) The applicant shall attach copies of certificate of relevant technical training, *or* record of employment showing his/her experience in this type of security work.
