The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Landlord and Tenant (Consolidation) (Amendment) Bill 2003

The Secretary for Housing, Planning and Lands moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Boundary Facilities Improvement Tax Bill

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

<u>Motions</u>

<u>Proposed resolution under section 6(3) of the Betting Duty</u> <u>Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that with effect from 1 August 2003 section 6(1)(b) of the Betting Duty Ordinance be amended by repealing "19%" and substituting "20%".

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under section 3(4) of the Betting Duty</u> <u>Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that with effect from 1 August 2003 section 3(3)(b) of the Betting Duty Ordinance be amended by repealing "76%" and substituting "75%".

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Members' Motions</u>

Proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance

Hon IP Kwok-him moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that in relation to the Fire Services (Fire Hazard Abatement) Regulation, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 113 of 2003 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 14 May 2003, the period for amending subsidiary legislation referred to in section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) be extended under section 34(4) of that Ordinance to the meeting of 2 July 2003.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Resumption of private streets

Hon CHAN Kam-lam drew the attention of the President to the absence of a quorum. The President directed the Clerk to summon Members to the meeting. A quorum was then present.

Hon IP Kwok-him moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the fragmented ownership of many of the private streets in the territory has given rise to poor management of such streets, resulting in their facilities falling into disrepair and sewers bursting, thereby creating breeding grounds for viruses and posing hazards to public health, this Council urges the Government to re-formulate the policy direction for private street resumption, so as to provide the relevant policy bureaux with sufficient powers and resources to effect the resumption of the remaining 104 private streets under the Private Street Resumption Programme, with a view to fully resolving the various problems arising from private streets, thereby improving the environment of the community and enhancing people's quality of life.

Question on Hon IP Kwok-him's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG and Hon James TO would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG and Hon James TO respectively spoke on the motion and their amendments.

While Hon James TO was speaking, the President left the chair at 5:15 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

Nine Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon IP Kwok-him spoke on the amendments.

At 6:05 pm, while Hon IP Kwok-him was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

The Secretary for Home Affairs spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG moved the following amendment to Hon IP Kwok-him's motion:

add "and amend the relevant legislation" after "this То Council urges the Government to re-formulate the policy direction for private street resumption"; to delete "effect the resumption of the remaining 104" after "so as to provide the relevant policy bureaux with sufficient powers and resources to" and substitute with "adopt decisive measures to effect the expeditious resumption of all the"; to add "original" after "private streets under the"; and to add "which are still beset with problems of environmental hygiene management" after "Private Street Resumption and poor Programme".

Question on Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG's amendment to Hon IP Kwokhim's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

The President stated that as Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG's amendment had been agreed, she granted leave for Hon James TO to revise the terms of his amendment and explain them to the Council.

Hon James TO moved the following revised amendment to Hon IP Kwok-him's motion as amended by Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG and explained the revised wording of his amendment to the Council:

To add "while respecting the wishes of the majority of the owners, and to consider according priority to the redevelopment of such streets" after "which are still beset with problems of environmental hygiene and poor management".

Question on Hon James TO's further amendment to Hon IP Kwokhim's motion as amended by Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG proposed and put.

Hon IP Kwok-him claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 20 were present, seven were in favour of the amendment, five against it and eight abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 22 were present, 13 were in favour of the amendment, seven against it and one abstained. (Voting record in the Appendix.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon IP Kwok-him replied.

Question on Hon IP Kwok-him's motion as amended by Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG put and agreed to.

Asia's World City

Hon Abraham SHEK moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the Government has proposed to position Hong Kong as "Asia's World City", this Council urges the Government to fully evaluate and assess Hong Kong's current economic and social conditions, comprehensively review the policies and strategies relevant to Hong Kong's position as an international city, promote the building of a more open, tolerant, receptive and innovative city image, and reinforce and enhance Hong Kong's international status, so as to make Hong Kong truly "Asia's World City".

Question on Hon Abraham SHEK's motion proposed.

The President stated that Dr Hon YEUNG Sum would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum moved the following amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion and addressed the Council:

To add "democratic, human rights-respecting, equitable," after "promote the building of a more".

Question on Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion proposed.

11 Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon Abraham SHEK spoke on the amendment.

The Chief Secretary for Administration spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Dr Hon YEUNG Sum's amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion put and agreed to.

Hon Abraham SHEK replied.

Question on Hon Abraham SHEK's motion as amended by Dr Hon YEUNG Sum put and agreed to.
