TEAM CLEAN

PURPOSE

In the wake of the SARS outbreak, Team Clean was set up on the instruction of the Chief Executive to develop and take forward proposals to improve the state of environmental hygiene in Hong Kong. This paper informs Members of the mission, terms of reference, work plan and the strategy of Team Clean.

MISSION

2. Team Clean's mission is to establish and promote a sustainable, cross-sectoral approach to improve environmental hygiene in Hong Kong.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 3. The terms of reference of Team Clean are as follows -
 - (a) To develop a coherent system and strategy for integrating and augmenting environmental hygiene improvement initiatives across all concerned bureaux and departments in Government. The system and strategy should be capable of sustaining a high level of cleanliness throughout the territory.
 - (b) To determine the relative priorities of areas targeted for improvement action, marshalling as much as possible wider community support, particularly that of the District Councils and NGOs to help tackle these areas.

- (c) To draw up within a period of three weeks a work plan of short-term measures to be taken and to steer and direct the implementation of these measures.
- (d) To establish within a period of three months a sustainable system and a timeframe for implementing the medium- and long-term initiatives.

STRATEGY

- The following is the strategy adopted by Team Clean in 6. approaching the task of cleaning up Hong Kong -
 - Clean (a) Sustainability: Team fully recognizes that improvement initiatives recommended must be sustainable. One-off campaigns can achieve some success but the achievements are limited and the effects not lasting. clean up Hong Kong for good, the improvements must be both thorough and sustainable.
 - (b) Early results: Team Clean considers that the attainment of early results is necessary for meeting community expectation, inspiring public confidence in Government's determination and ability to improve public hygiene and sustaining the new-found momentum in the community for determined Government action to clean up the city.

- (c) New approach: we are aware of the long-standing environmental problems in rear lanes, private streets and old tenement buildings. The solutions to these problems require a novel approach. We believe strongly that to resolve these perennial problems, the Administration must be prepared to break new policy grounds and abandon traditional demarcation of responsibilities in Government.
- (d) <u>Establishing a model</u>: through the implementation of pilot schemes in the short term plan, Team Clean will repeat the successful modus operandi in tackling similar problems in the longer term.
- (e) <u>Community involvement</u>: the hygiene and cleanliness of a city can only be maintained with the support of its people. Any undertaking relying on Government efforts alone is doomed to failure. To ensure that our success is lasting, the Administration will encourage community participation in taking forward the various improvement measures.
