Introduction

This paper briefs Members on the latest developments of the AIDS Trust Fund (the Fund).

Background

- 2. With a grant of \$350 million from the Finance Committee, the Fund was established in April 1993 to provide: -
 - (a) Ex gratia payments for persons affected by HIV through the transfusion of blood products prior to August 1985; and
 - (b) Funding support to medical and support services for AIDS patients and public education projects to enhance public awareness of AIDS prevention and acceptance of AIDS patients.
- 3. The Fund is administered on the advice of the Council for the AIDS Trust Fund (the Council), members of which are appointed by the Chief Executive. The Council is under-pinned by three sub-committees to assess and approve funding applications. The three sub-committees are the Ex-gratia Payment Sub-Committee, the Medical and Support Services Sub-Committee and the Publicity and Public Education Sub-Committee.

Operation of the AIDS Trust Fund

- 4. In early 2003, the Council approved funding support of \$37.1 million to 15 organisations for a period up to three years. So far the Fund has disbursed \$228.4 million to support 373 publicity and public education projects (\$71.1 million), 95 medical and support services projects (\$123.7 million) and ex-gratia payment for 58 eligible persons (\$33.6 million). The balance of the Fund stood at \$334.6 million as at 1 July 2003.
