Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress report as at the end of April 2003

Purpose

This paper updates Members on the latest progress of implementing the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

Enrolment

2. The enrolment position as at the end of April 2003 is as follows:

3. The enrolment of employers and relevant employees has stabilised. The number of SEP has marginally increased by about 1 000 in the last month, reflecting the continued restructuring in the employment market. At the end of April 2003, 13 200 employers, 234 200 employees and 23 100 SEPs were in the Industry Schemes.

Complaint Handling

Complaints received by the MPFA

4. Of the total 969 complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) in April 2003, 99% concerned scheme members and 464 employers were involved. The breakdown is as follows:

Complaints received by the Labour Department (LD)

- 5. In April 2003, the LD received 27 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages.
- 6. Of a total of 85 complaints received from 1 January 2003 to the end of April 2003:
 - 20 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
 - 34 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal for adjudication;
 - 16 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund;
 - 11 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation;
 - 3 cases were awaiting the employees' decision on whether to lodge claims with the LD for conciliation; and
 - 1 case was awaiting the employee's decision on whether to lodge claim at the Labour Tribunal after conciliation.
