Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress report as at the end of October 2002

Purpose

This paper updates Members on the latest progress of implementing the Mandatory Provident Fund ("MPF") System.

Enrolment

2. The enrolment position as at the end of October 2002 is summarized as follows:

3. The overall enrolment rates of employers and employees increased by 0.2% and 0.1% respectively while the SEPs' enrolment rate dropped slightly by 0.1%. As at the end of October 2002, a total of 13 000 employers, 212 300 employees and 22 500 SEPs have joined the Industry Schemes. The enrolment in industry schemes largely remained stable.

Complaint Handling

Complaints received by the MPFA

4. Of the total 736 complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) in October 2002, 97% concerned scheme members, and involved 459 employers. The breakdown is as follows:

Complaints received by the Labour Department (LD)

- 5. In October 2002, the LD received 29 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages.
- 6. Of a total of 239 complaints received from 1 January 2002 to the end of October 2002:
 - 74 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
 - 98 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
 - 29 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund;
 - 25 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation;
 - 5 cases were awaiting the employees' decision on whether to lodge claims with the LD for conciliation; and
 - 8 cases were awaiting the employees' decision on whether to lodge claims at the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board after conciliation.

^{*} In October 2002, proactive inspections were targeted at the cleaning & security services contractors of large residential estates, interviews of the contractors' employees were conducted during the inspections.

8. As regards contribution surcharge (item B of the above table), the notices were issued to employers with contributions in arrears, covering the contribution periods of August 2002 and earlier.

Education and Publicity

9. In October, the MPFA continued to publicize the legislative amendments to the MPF Schemes Ordinance. A total of 9 seminars and briefings were organized for employers' groups, human resources professionals, trade unions, professional bodies, community organizations and business associations, attracting more than 400 participants.

10. Community outreach remained a crucial part of the MPFA's public education work. Activities organized included a total of 27 seminars, talks and sessions of MPF Info Stations. In addition, a series of MPF Carnivals jointly organized with political parties kicked off in late-October 2002.
