Antiquities and Monuments (Declaration of
Historical Buildings) Notice 2002

(Made under section 3(1) of the Antiquities and Monuments
Ordinance (Cap. 53) after consultation with the
Antiquities Advisory Board and with the
approval of the Chief Executive)

1. Declaration of historical buildings

The following places are declared to be historical buildings---

(a) the Hung Shing Temple (also known as Hung Shing Miu) at Lot No. 73 in D.D. 265, Kau Sai Chau, Sai Kung, New Territories, and the adjoining land, delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. SKM 5179 signed and deposited by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance; and

(b) the Tin Hau Temple at Lo Tsun Tsz Tong Tsun Lot No. 1 in D.D. 83, Lung Yeuk Tau, Fanling, New Territories, and the adjoining land, delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. DNM 937a signed and deposited by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance.

Explanatory Note

This Notice declares---

(a) the Hung Shing Temple (also known as Hung Shing Miu) at Kau Sai Chau, Sai Kung, New Territories, and the adjoining land; and

(b) the Tin Hau Temple at Lung Yeuk Tau, Fanling, New Territories, and the adjoining land,

to be historical buildings for the purposes of the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance (Cap. 53).
