## Second Reading

## Appropriation Bill 2004

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 10~March~2004~resumed, in accordance with Rule 67(2)~of the Rules of Procedure.

17 Members and Hon Emily LAU spoke on the motion.

While Hon Emily LAU was speaking, the President left the chair at 5:45 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

Another four Members and Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG spoke on the motion.

At 6:40 pm, while Hon Mrs Sophie LEUNG was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Eight more Members spoke on the motion.

The President suspended the meeting at 8:23 pm.

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The Council resumed at 2:30 pm on 22 April 2004 and continued to debate the Second Reading of the Appropriation Bill 2004.

13 Members and Hon Margaret NG spoke on the motion.

While Hon Margaret NG was speaking, the President left the chair at 5:32 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

Another seven Members and Hon CHOY So-yuk spoke on the motion.

At 7:12 pm, while Hon CHOY So-yuk was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Two more Members spoke on the motion.

Hon Miriam LAU moved that the debate on the motion be adjourned to the meeting to be held on 28.4.2003.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

### Motion for Adjournment

Before calling upon Hon Frederick FUNG to move the motion for adjournment, the President clarified the circumstances relating to the permission given for moving the motion.

The President said that she noticed that there had been media reports and comments in that morning that some Members who were dissatisfied with the rulings had accused, outside the Council, the rulings as politically motivated and aimed at canvassing votes. The President said that she was saddened by such acts of Members criticising the President's rulings. This was not the first time these happened.

The President said that she had all along been carrying out her duties from the procedural point of view and had been impartial, selfless, fearless and unwavering, in order that the Rules of Procedure are respected and to preserve the dignity of the Legislative Council. It was improper and ill-judged for Members to comment on the President's rulings outside the Council. She urged Members to abide by the convention and cooperate to uphold the dignity and reputation of the Council.

Hon Frederick FUNG moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That the Council do now adjourn for the purpose of debating the Report by the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region to the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress on whether there is a need to amend the methods for selecting the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in 2007 and for forming the Legislative Council of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in 2008.

Question on the motion proposed.

20 Members, the Secretary for Constitutional Affairs and the Chief Secretary for Administration spoke on the motion.

Hon Frederick FUNG replied.

Question on the motion put and negatived.

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#### RESOLUTION

## RESOLVED that -

- (a) the Merchant Shipping (Local Vessels)
  (Certification and Licensing) Regulation, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 27 of 2004 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 3
  March 2004, be amended -
  - (i) in section 2(1), by adding 
    ""length overall" (總長度), in

    relation to a local vessel,

    means the distance between the

    foreside of the foremost fixed

permanent structure and the

aftside of the aftermost fixed

permanent structure of the

vessel;";

- (ii) in section 6(3)(a), by repealing "有效";
- (iii) in section 10(4)(a)(v), by adding "of the vessel" after "construction";
  - (iv) in section 19, by adding -
    - "(8) If the Director refuses to
      issue or renew a temporary licence,
      he shall notify the applicant of the
      refusal and the reasons therefor.";
    - (v) in section 21, by adding -
      - "(4) A permission for a laidup vessel shall be in such form as the Director may determine.";
  - (vi) in section 23 -
    - (A) by renumbering subsections (5) and(6) as subsections (6) and (7)respectively;
    - (B) by adding -
      - "(5) If the Director
        refuses an application under
        subsection (2), he shall notify
        the applicant of the refusal
        and the reasons therefor.";

- (C) in subsection (7), by repealing
  "(5)" and substituting "(6)";
- (vii) in section 26, by adding -
  - "(5) If the Director refuses an application under subsection (2), he shall notify the applicant of the refusal and the reasons therefor.";
- (viii) in section 49(2), by adding "有關" before "船隻";
  - (ix) in section 54(1)(a), by adding "書面" after "作出的";
    - (x) by repealing section 55 and
      substituting -
      - "55. Certificate of ownership, etc. not to be relied on for other purposes
      - (1) A certificate of ownership, full licence, temporary licence, permission for a laid-up vessel or any other document issued, granted, renewed or endorsed under the provisions of this Regulation or section 66 of the Ordinance is issued, granted, renewed or endorsed for the purposes of the Ordinance only.

- (2) Despite any information as to ownership of or interest in a local vessel contained in a document referred to in subsection (1) in respect of the vessel, the document shall not be taken as making, for any purpose otherwise than of the Ordinance, a representation as to who owns, or has any interest in, the vessel.
- (3) No action shall lie against the Government, the Director or any other officer in respect of any loss or damage suffered by any person as a result of any error or omission in the information as to ownership of or interest in a local vessel contained in a document referred to in subsection (1) in respect of the vessel, if the error or omission was made in good faith and in the ordinary course of the performance of any function relating to the document.";
- (b) the Merchant Shipping (Local Vessels)(Typhoon

  Shelters) Regulation, published in the Gazette as

Legal Notice No. 28 of 2004 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 3 March 2004, be amended -

- (i) by renumbering sections 11 and 12 as sections 12 and 13 respectively;
- (ii) by adding -

## "11. Appeals

- (1) Any person aggrieved by the
  exercise of the power conferred on
  the Director under section 4(6), (7)
  or (8) may appeal to the
  Administrative Appeals Board.
- (2) An appeal under subsection

  (1) shall be made within 14 days

  after an endorsement is made or a

  direction is given by virtue of the

  exercise of the power under section

  4(6), (7) or (8).
- (3) An appeal made under subsection (1) shall not affect the operation of the endorsement or the direction prior to the determination of the appeal.";
- (iii) in the Schedule, within the square brackets, by repealing "11" and substituting "12".
