2. <u>Pension suspension policy for retired civil servants</u>	17.11.2003	<p>(a) The Administration was requested to provide its written response to the following motion passed at the Panel meeting:</p> <p>“本事務委員會要求政府立即檢討現時由公務員轉任問責官員後，仍可在問責官員的任期內同時享有公務員的退休金的安排。”</p> <p>(English translation)</p> <p>“That this Panel calls on the Government to review immediately the existing arrangement whereby civil servants appointed as Principal Officials under the Accountability System are still entitled to receive their pensions during their tenure as Principal Officials.”</p>	Response to item (a) awaited.

		<p>The Administration was also requested to address, in its written response, the question raised by members on who was responsible for the review of the relevant arrangement.</p> <p>(b) The Administration was requested to provide further information on the 442 cases referred to in paragraph 9 of the information paper, as follows:</p> <p>(i) A breakdown of the 340 cases involving re-appointments to the Government and 102 cases involving service in the gazetted subvented organizations by the type of jobs;</p> <p>(ii) A breakdown of the 29 cases involving retired civil servants formerly holding directorate positions by the type of jobs; and</p> <p>(iii) Information on whether there were cases where consecutive short-term employment had been offered to the retired civil servants concerned and the number of such cases.</p>	<p>Response to item (b) was issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)527/03-04(01) on 8 December 2003.</p>
