## Input from SWD in response to Inquiry raised by Hon James To at the Security Panel Meeting

*The Understanding the Adolescent Project (UAP)* 

- The Social Welfare Department (SWD) first launched the UAP in secondary schools in the 2001/02 school year as part of the Government's initiatives to strengthen support for young people. New resources have been earmarked to implement the project in all secondary schools by phases in three-year's time from 2001/02 to 2003/04. As at the 2003/04 school year, a total of 308 schools have joined the UAP.
- Believing that early identification and timely intervention for potential youth-at-risk is an important step towards prevention of juvenile problems, the objectives of the UAP is to identify the developmental needs of Secondary One students and to provide them with tailor-made primary preventive programme with a view to building up their resilience in meeting life's challenges.
- Apart from organizing preventive programme for students, parents and teachers are also arranged to take part in workshops to help enhance their knowledge and skills in communicating with as well as addressing the needs of young people.
- In the 2001/02 and 2002/03 school years, a total of 11 600 students and their families have participated in the project.
- The positive effects of the UAP on students, parents, as well as teachers have been confirmed in an evaluation study conducted by the Centre for Epidemiology and Biostatistics of the Chinese University of Hong Kong in the 2001/02 school year. The primary preventive programme is found to be effective in improving students' ability on various dimension including anger management, conflict resolution, problem solving, communication with others, relationship with teachers, classroom behaviour, belongingness to family and school, optimism, sense of responsibility and willingness to help others. Similarly, teachers and parents have reported better willingness and ability to understand as well as communicate with the students.
- As funding for the UAP in all secondary schools will terminate by end 2003-04, SWD is actively exploring alternatives to sustain the project in the 2004/05 school year and beyond.

• Recognizing that children nowadays mature early and primary students are already exhibiting various at-risk behaviours, the UAP has been extended to primary schools with 18 primary schools participating in a three-year pilot study under the Education and Manpower Bureau (EMB) starting from the 2001/02 school year. Upon completion of the pilot study, EMB plans to roll out the project to 400 and 500 primary schools in the 2004/05 and 2005/06 school years respectively.

Family Conference for Children / Juveniles cautioned under the Police Superintendent's Discretion Scheme

- In response to the raising of the minimum age of criminal responsibility and to enhance support for children / juveniles who have infringed the law, the Government has implemented the following initiatives with a view to facilitating timely intervention by relevant professionals -
  - (a) strengthening existing mechanism for referring children and young people who come to the attention of the Police due to their non-law abiding behaviour but have yet to reach the minimum age. An information leaflet will be given to the parents / guardian / carer upon the arrest of the child / juvenile which details the circumstances under which a juvenile may require follow-up services and lists available support services provided by Government departments and NGOs. The objectives are to bring to the parents' / guardians' / carers' attention the problems of their children, alert them about the seriousness of their children's problems, and encourage them to seek professional assistance; and
  - (b) introducing a formalized system in the form of Family Conference to decide on the appropriate follow-up services for young offenders. The new measure, which comes into effect in October 2003, applies to young offenders who have been cautioned under the Police Superintendent's Discretion Scheme more than once or are in need of services of three or more Government departments / agencies. The Family Conference brings together family members of cautioned juveniles and relevant professionals to assess the needs of the juveniles and to draw up follow-up plan to address the needs identified.
