## ANTIQUITIES AND MONUMENTS (DECLARATION OF HISTORICAL BUILDING) NOTICE 2004

(Made under section 3(1) of the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance (Cap. 53) after consultation with the Antiquities Advisory Board and with the approval of the Chief Executive)

## 1. Declaration of historical building

The building known as "馬禮遜樓" and its adjoining land within the Hoh Fuk Tong Centre (also known as Ho Fuk Tong Centre) situated at the Remaining Portion of Tuen Mun Town Lot No. 117, No. 28 Castle Peak Road, Tuen Mun, New Territories, delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. TMM 2045e signed and deposited by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Tuen Mun New Territories Land Registry, in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance, is declared to be a historical building.

## 2. Repeal

The Antiquities and Monuments (Declaration of Proposed Monument) Notice 2003 (Cap. 53 sub. leg. D) is repealed.
