Date of meeting	Follow-up actions required
19 April 2005	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To provide the details as to how the list of nominating organizations tailored for the hybrid model would be promulgated. 2. To consider how the principle of representation could be enshrined in clause 9. 3. To advise whether the number of members representing workers would be increased.
21 June 2005	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To consider providing in law that meetings of the Construction Industry Council (CIC) be open to the public except under certain specified circumstances. One suggestion is to add a clause in Schedule 2 to the Bill. 2. To provide information on the practices of other public bodies which conduct open meetings. The Town Planning Board and the Housing Authority have been quoted as examples. 3. To obtain a written undertaking from the Provisional Construction Industry Co-ordination Board that it supports meetings of the future CIC be open to the public. 4. To make an undertaking during the second reading debate on the Bill that it is the Government's committed policy to open up meetings of CIC.
20 July 2005	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To provide an annual breakdown of value of construction works by the public and private sectors from 2002 to 2004 which are subject to levy.

To provide information on the measures taken by CITA to enhance enrolment of students.
