Bills

First Reading

Revenue (Abolition of Estate Duty) Bill 2005

Smoking (Public Health) (Amendment) Bill 2005

The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Revenue (Abolition of Estate Duty) Bill 2005

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Smoking (Public Health) (Amendment) Bill 2005

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

As Hon LEUNG Kwok-hung, who was to move the next motion, was not in the Chamber, the President suspended the meeting at 12:54 pm.

The Council resumed at 1:00 pm.

Members' Motions

Regretting interpretation of the Basic Law by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress

Hon LEUNG Kwok-hung moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council regrets that the HKSAR Government has twice requested the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress ("NPCSC") to interpret the provisions of the Basic Law in 1999 and 2005 respectively and requests the NPCSC to withdraw its decisions in the last two interpretation exercises, and demands the SAR Government to apologize to the people of Hong Kong for having done so and undertake not to further request the NPCSC to interpret the Basic Law; furthermore, this Council also urges the NPCSC to rescind its decision made on 26 April 2004 to rule out the election of the Chief Executive and all Members of the Legislative Council by universal suffrage in 2007 and 2008 respectively in Hong Kong which throttles the rights of the people of Hong Kong to the

full implementation of election by universal suffrage in 2007 and 2008, as well as demands the Chief Secretary for Administration, Hon Donald TSANG Yam-kuen, to rescind the four constitutional development reports, so as to give a true account of the facts.

Question on the motion proposed.

The Secretary for Justice spoke on the motion.

While the Secretary for Justice was speaking, the President left the chair at 1:17 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

10 Members and Hon TAM Yiu-chung spoke on the motion.

At 2:26 pm, while Hon TAM Yiu-chung was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Another six Members and Hon Albert Jinghan CHENG spoke on the motion.

With the President's permission, Hon LEE Wing-tat elucidated on a point he had made earlier which had been misunderstood by Hon Albert Jinghan CHENG.

One more Member and the Secretary for Constitutional Affairs spoke on the motion.

With the President's permission, Hon Margaret NG elucidated on a point she had made earlier which had been misunderstood by the Secretary for Constitutional Affairs.

Question on the motion put.

Hon LEUNG Kwok-hung claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, five were in favour of the motion and 20 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 27 were present, 15 were in favour of the motion and 11 against it. (Voting record in Appendix I.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Comprehensive review of the Inland Revenue Ordinance

Hon TAM Heung-man moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as it has been nearly 30 years since the Government conducted a comprehensive review of the Inland Revenue Ordinance ("IRO") in 1976, in order to further strengthen and expand Hong Kong's edge as an ideal place for investment in the international arena, this Council urges the Government to, under the principle of maintaining a simple tax regime with low tax rates:

- (a) expeditiously conduct a comprehensive review of the IRO, so as to ensure that it meets the needs of the current economic environment and mode of business;
- (b) make the provisions of the IRO more simple and certain, and enhance consistency in its implementation; and
- (c) establish a statutory advisory body on taxation for conducting a policy study on the IRO, and ensure that members of the advisory body come from different sectors,

with a view to enhancing Hong Kong's competitiveness and its attractiveness to international investors.

Question on Hon TAM Heung-man's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing and Hon LEE Cheuk-yan would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing and Hon LEE Cheuk-yan consecutively spoke on the motion and the amendments.

20 Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon TAM Heung-man spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing moved the following amendment to Hon TAM Heung-man's motion:

To delete "as it has been nearly 30 years since the Government conducted a comprehensive review of the Inland Revenue Ordinance ('IRO') in 1976," after "That, "; to delete ": (a) expeditiously conduct a comprehensive review of the IRO, so as to ensure that it meets the needs of the current economic environment and mode of business; (b) make the provisions of the IRO more simple and certain, and enhance consistency in its implementation; and (c) establish a statutory advisory body on taxation for conducting a policy study on the IRO, and ensure that members of the advisory body come from different

sectors" after "low tax rates"; and to add "examine the specific issues relating to Hong Kong's taxation system and the implementation of the Inland Revenue Ordinance," before "with a view to enhancing Hong Kong's competitiveness".

Question on Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing's amendment to Hon TAM Heung-man's motion proposed and put.

Hon TAM Heung-man claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present and 25 were in favour of the amendment; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 29 were present, 25 were in favour of the amendment, two against it and one abstained. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was agreed.

Hon Miriam LAU rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions in relation to the motion or amendments thereto on "Comprehensive review of the Inland Revenue Ordinance", the Council do proceed to each of such divisions after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

The President stated that as Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing's amendment had been agreed, she granted leave for Hon LEE Cheuk-yan to revise the terms of his amendment and explain them to the Council.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan moved the following further amendment to Hon TAM Heung-man's motion as amended by Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing and explained the revised terms of his amendment to the Council:

To add "; this Council also urges the Government to consider introducing progressive profits tax, so as to fully implement the principle of 'those who have the means pay more', and maintain abundant tax revenues to cope with Hong Kong's development and social needs" after "attractiveness to international investors".

With the President's permission, Hon James TIEN elucidated on a point he had made earlier which had been misunderstood by Hon LEE Cheuk-yan.

Question on Hon LEE Cheuk-yan's amendment to Hon TAM Heung-man's motion as amended by Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing proposed and put.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, 10 were in favour of the amendment, 14 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 29 were present, 26 were in favour of the amendment and two against it. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon TAM Heung-man replied.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury elucidated on a point he had made earlier.

Question on Hon TAM Heung-man's motion as amended by Hon Patrick LAU Sau-shing put and agreed to.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 18 May 2005 at 11:00 am.

The Council was adjourned at 7:21 pm.
