**Finance Committee**  
**Follow-up to meeting on 10 June 2005**

**"Replacement of marine craft for  
Versatile Maritime Policing Response"**


At the above Finance Committee meeting, the Administration was requested to advise the number of marine craft which have been procured through tender over the past 20 years, and amongst them how many were successfully tendered by local ship manufacturers.

In the past 20 years, a total of 73 large or medium sized Police barges / launches were procured by the Marine Police through tender. Of these launches, 38, including the largest ones, were built by local ship builders. A detailed list is provided at **Annex I**.

Apart from the larger launches, a total of 86 smaller tenders / craft were purchased through open tender in the same period. Most of these vessels are attached to a mother craft, and purchased as a bundle with the mother craft in the same tender. Due to operational needs, most of them are inflatable craft, which local ship builders do not manufacture. As a result, only 6 non-inflatable craft among these tenders were manufactured by local ship builders. A detailed list is provided at **Annex II**.

It should be pointed out that for craft built overseas, they still have to be supported by local contractors during delivery, trials, acceptance and subsequent maintenance.
