Reply:

The revised estimate for remuneration for special appointments is to cover provisions for 4 positions, namely, Director of the Chief Executive's Office (DCEO), Senior Special Assistant (SSA), Senior Personal Assistant (SPA) and Personal Chauffeur (PC). Below is the breakdown of provisions for these posts in 2004-05 revised estimate-

Was the lease immediately terminated upon the approval by the Central Government of his resignation? If no, will the rent of the flat continue to be paid by public money? If it will, for what reasons? If it will not, what is the latest arrangement regarding the rent?
- (b) Is there provision earmarked for studying the issue of a permanent official residence for future CEs?

Reply:

- (a) In line with the prevailing practice for civil servants, Mr Tung is given a 60-day grace period to stay in the official residence which the Government has rented. In consultation with the landlord on the lease of the adjacent flat which runs up to June 2007, the Government is exploring options that may alleviate the rent cost after the grace period.
- (b) No provision is earmarked for the study of a permanent official residence for future CEs.
