

## Updated Legislative Programme 2004-05

This Programme sets out the main pieces of legislation which the Government plans to introduce into the Legislative Council in the second half of the 2004-05 legislative session. This Programme may need to be adjusted in light of developments to reflect changing priorities.

2.	Carriage by Air (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To bring our regulatory framework governing carriage by air in line with international standards by applying an international convention to the HKSAR.</li> </ul>	EDLB
3.	Certification for Employee Benefits (Chinese Medicine) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To recognize certification by a registered Chinese medicine practitioner for the purpose of entitlement to certain employee benefits under the Employment Ordinance, the Employees' Compensation Ordinance and the Pneumoconiosis (Compensation) Ordinance and to provide for related matters.</li> </ul>	EDLB
4.	Civil Aviation (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To release certain aircraft owners from strict liability.</li> </ul>	EDLB

7.	Hong Kong Council for Academic Accreditation (Amendments) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>To empower the Hong Kong Council for Academic Accreditation to perform the quality assurance role underpinning the qualifications framework.</li></ul>	EMB

Protection of Endangered Species of Animals and Plants Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>To extend control over trade in medicine made from endangered species so as to fully meet the requirements of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, which has been extended to Hong Kong, and to simplify the existing provisions to facilitate compliance and enforcement.</li></ul>	ETWB
9.	Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>To introduce a Probationary Driving Licence Scheme to new drivers of private cars and light goods vehicles and to impose on them a speed limit and other driving restrictions.</li></ul>	ETWB

Waste Disposal (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>To introduce legislative controls on the collection and disposal of clinical waste to protect public health; to tighten up control on the disposal of imported non-hazardous waste in Hong Kong; and to introduce a legal ban on the import of hazardous waste from developed countries into or through Hong Kong in accordance with the Basel Convention.</li></ul>	ETWB

17.	Securities and Futures (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2005	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To enhance the quality of the equity market by giving statutory backing to major requirements for listing, and to make miscellaneous amendments to keep up with market developments.</li></ul>	FSTB

Building Management (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To improve the conditions for owners' corporations in their performance of duties and exercise of powers</li><li>• To rationalize the appointment procedures of a management committee and its members</li><li>• To afford better protection for property owners.</li></ul>	HAB

Aviation Security (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To strengthen the control over unruly passenger offences committed on board Hong Kong-registered civil aircraft, and to extend Hong Kong's jurisdiction over unruly passenger offences committed on board foreign aircraft outside Hong Kong while they are coming to land at Hong Kong.</li></ul>	SB

Hong Kong Management Areas Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To enable certain areas in China that are outside Hong Kong to be declared as Hong Kong Management Areas (HKMA), apply the laws of Hong Kong in HKMA, assist the construction of certain documents made subsequent to the declaration of any HKMA, and provide for related purposes.</li></ul>	SB
27.	Immigration (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To provide for the conducting of immigration examination, the granting of permission to land and imposition of limit/ condition of stay through automated means.</li></ul>	SB
28.	Independent Police Complaints Council Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To enhance the credibility of the existing police complaints system by making the Independent Police Complaints Council a statutory body and specifying its composition, functions and powers in law.</li></ul>	SB
29.	Marriage (Amendment) Bill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To allow appointment of civil celebrants to celebrate marriages and to provide for other incidental and connected matters.</li></ul>	SB
