I Confirmation of minutes and matters arising

(LC Paper No. CB(1)2074/04-05 - Minutes of meeting held on 6 July 2005)

The minutes of the meeting held on 6 July 2005 were confirmed.

II Meeting with the deputations/the Administration

(LC Paper No. CB(1)2109/04-05(01) - Submission from Ocean Park)

- proposed resolution under Section 22 of the Tung Chung Cable Car Ordinance (Cap. 577) moved by the Secretary for Economic Development and Labour;
- the Legal Service Division Report;
- information paper for the Economic Services Panel meeting held on 2 June 2005; and
- minutes of meeting of the Economic Services Panel meeting held on 2 June 2005.

- 2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex A**).
- 3. The Chairman informed members that an invitation notice had been posted on the website of the Legislative Council and a press release had been issued to invite the public to give views on the proposed resolution under Section 22 of the Tung Chung Cable Car Ordinance (Cap.577). For this purpose, invitation letters had also been sent to the 18 District Councils, relevant Rural Committee and other organizations suggested by members. As of date, the Subcommittee had received a written submission from the Ocean Park Corporation. In addition, the Managing Director of the New Lantao Bus Co (1973) Ltd. (NLB) would present views to the Subcommittee at the meeting.
- 4. The Subcommittee noted that the Government had entered into a Project Agreement with the MTR Corporation Limited (MTRCL) in 2003 based on a Build-Operate-Transfer model for the Tung Chung Cable Car System (the Cable Car System) linking Tung Chung and Ngong Ping on the Lantau Island. The project was in good progress and was expected to complete in early 2006. MTRCL had appointed Skyrail-ITM (Hong Kong) Ltd, which had rich experience in operating a similar facility in Australia, to operate and manage the project. MTRCL estimated that there would be a patronage of 1.5 million in the first year of operation.
- 5. <u>The Subcommittee</u> also noted that the Cable Car System would become a major tourism facility of the Lantau Island. It was important for the Bylaw to be enacted before the opening of the Cable Car System. The proposed Tung Chung Cable Car Bylaw was to achieve the following purposes
 - (a) to provide safety precautions to passengers on the Cable Car System and people in the Cable Car System area;
 - (b) to avoid causing any inconvenience or nuisance to other passengers by authorizing MTRCL to manage certain conduct of passengers on the Cable Car System;
 - (c) to provide a system for the effective management of the Cable Car System such as the ticketing arrangement and the handling of property found on the Cable Car System and in the Cable Car System area; and
 - (d) to provide for proper traffic management in the Cable Car System area such as dealing with vehicles left there and regulating the conduct of drivers and vehicles in the Cable Car System area.
- 6. <u>Members</u> expressed concern about the impact of the Cable Car System on the operational viability of the existing public transport services (including franchised bus, ferry and taxi services), and this in turn would affect the provision of public transport services for local residents in Lantau. They were also of the view that proper arrangements should be in place to ensure that the Cable Car System would not adversely affect but would contribute to the tourism development in other parts of

Lantau. The Administration indicated that the overall policy for developing the Cable Car Project was to further develop Lantau as a tourism node. With the operation of the Cable Car, visitors to Lantau would increase which would promote the tourism development at locations other than Ngong Ping, e.g. Tai O, Mui Wo. As the pie grew bigger, it should be a win win situation for existing operators. In fact, MTRCL was discussing with NLB and other public transport operators on possible cooperative arrangements. Members urged the Tourism Commission and the Transport Department to play an active role in facilitating the discussions with a view to formulating appropriate arrangements that would achieve the objectives pertinent to tourism development in Lantau and avoid the Cable Car System causing adverse impact on the operational viability of existing public transport operators. The Government, however, should not interfere with the detailed arrangements between MTRC and other transport operators as they were commercial agreements.

- 7. In view of the impending commissioning of the Cable Car System, <u>members</u> considered that concrete arrangements should be arrived at among the parties concerned as soon as possible and the Administration should report to the Subcommittee on the results of the discussions by early September 2005.
- 8. <u>Members</u> also requested the Administration to provide the following information
 - (a) assessment on the impact of the future operation of the Cable Car System on existing public transport services with relevant quantitative information to substantiate the assessment; and
 - (b) assessment on whether upon completion of the Tung Chung Road widening project, the bus journey time between North and South Lantau would be reduced and if so, the extent of reduction in journey time.
