	According to the Administration, the new Arrangement provided a clear timetable for opening the Hong Kong/Mainland aviation market to more airlines and for expansion of capacity limits on individual routes. The limit on the total number of airlines allowed to participate

The limit on the total number of airlines allowed to participate in the market had been lifted immediately, while the number of routes that allowed "dual designation" by each side would be increased in phases, eventually covering all routes by winter 2006.

In order to enhance the competitiveness of the Hong Kong International Airport, views had been expressed that the Government should liaise with the Central People's Government and the relevant authorities with a view to implementing "co-location" of immigration and customs facilities at Hong Kong International Airport.
