III. Promoting tourism in the Islands District

15. Ms LEE Kwai-chun expressed concern that there were inadequate tourism-related facilities in the Islands District. She considered that the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) should take over the management of the Cheung Po Tsai Cave and the “little great wall” in Cheung Chau and launch publicity for these tourism spots.

16. Mr CHEUNG Hok-ming said that many rural public works could not be launched because of some residents’ refusal to surrender land. He considered that specific funds should be allocated for rural public works.

17. Ms CHAU Chuen-heung shared the view that many rural public works could not be launched because of residents’ refusal to surrender land. She considered that there should be separate funding for rural public works programmes and urban minor works programmes. She added that rural public works programmes should be expedited.

18. Mr KWONG Kwok-wai shared the view that specific funds should be dedicated for rural public works.
