VII. Provision of leisure and cultural facilities in Tin Shiu Wai

30. Ms KWONG Yuet-sum hoped that in providing supporting facilities to Tin Shiu Wai, due regard should also be given to other vulnerable groups such as middle-aged women, apart from youths and the elderly.

31. The Convenor suggested and members agreed to convey Ms KWONG's views in paragraph 30 above to the Panel on Home Affairs for follow-up.

VIII. Provision of leisure and cultural facilities in remote areas of YL

32. Mr MAN Fu-wan said that leisure and cultural facilities in remote areas of YL were also inadequate, and requested LegCo Members to take this matter up with the Administration. Mr LEUNG Fuk-yue and Mr KWOK Keung expressed similar view. Dr TANG Siu-tong pointed out that although YLDC had an annual budget of about \$20 million to provide leisure and cultural facilities in remote areas of YL, such a sum was far from adequate as it also included the carrying out of minor environmental improvement work. Moreover, there was the question of the difficulty of getting agreement from landowners to provide land for the construction of the facilities.

33. The Convenor suggested and members agreed to convey DC members' views mentioned in paragraph 32 above to the Panel on Home Affairs for follow-up.
