Clause 4

- (a) to advise, after liaison with the relevant Bureau, the timetable for taking forward the Law Reform Commission's suggestions on criminalising unauthorised interception and covert surveillance;
- (b) to explain why the Chief Executive would not be subject to the Bill;
- (c) to explain the rationale for imposing disciplinary actions but not criminal liability on public officers breaching the proposed legislation;
- (d) to provide information on local legislation stipulating prohibitions on public officers without imposing any criminal sanction for violation;
- (e) to provide information on the other enactments referred to in clause 4(2)(c); and
- (f) to consider amending clause 4(1) along the lines of "no public officer shall, directly or indirectly, including through any other person, carry out any interception.".
- 3. The Bills Committee requested the Secretariat to provide information on the deliberations of the Subcommittee on Application on Certain Provisions of the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance to the Chief Executive.
