II. Meeting with the Administration

(LC Paper No. CB(2)760/07-08(01))

- 2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>Members</u> noted that the Chief Executive (CE) would declare publicly all gifts of perceived value above HK\$400 presented to him and would purchase such gifts if he wished to retain them for his personal use. These arrangements were devised by CE's Office, making reference to the rules applicable to civil servants concerning acceptance of gifts. To better ensure transparency and accountability in relation to the acceptance and disposal of gifts to CE, the Administration was requested to formalise the above arrangements and set up a committee comprising people from outside the Government to make changes to the arrangements where appropriate. <u>The Administration</u> agreed to revert in writing.

- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> recapped the three main concerns of the Bills Committee as follows -
 - (a) CE should be bound by the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (POBO) (Cap. 201) as all other citizens of Hong Kong;
 - (b) there should be sufficient safeguards against any corruption complaint against CE being covered up by the Administration under the referral mechanism; and
 - (c) express provision to provide immunity for Members of the Legislative Council in disclosing information contained in Secretary for Justice's referrals in the course of discharging the constitutional duty under Article 73(9) of the Basic Law should be added to POBO.

- 5. At the request of the Chairman, <u>the Administration</u> undertook to provide/consolidate its response to these concerns as raised by members at previous meetings.
- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> sought members' view on inviting deputations to give views on the Bill. <u>Members</u> expressed support.
- 7. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 5:30 pm.
