- (a) According to our records going back to the past five years, there was not any case in which a Hong Kong resident had been prosecuted in the Mainland as a result of ICAC assistance under the Mutual Case Assistance Scheme. However, there were seven cases (involving 14 Mainlanders) in which Mainlanders were prosecuted in Hong Kong for corruption and / or related offences that involved enquiries conducted in the Mainland under the Mutual Case Assistance Scheme.
