Updated Legislative Programme 2006-07

In line with established practice, I attach at the *Annex* an updated programme of bills (20 in total) which the Administration plans to introduce into the Council in the remaining months of the current legislative session.

Taking into account the seven bills already introduced (excluding the Appropriation Bill 2007), there is no change in the total number of bills (27) forecast for the 2006-07 legislative session. A new item on the Import and Export (Amendment) Bill is included while the timing for the Crimes (Amendment) Bill has to be adjusted.

The updated programme serves as an indication of the Administration's latest legislative proposals, and is subject to change in light of developments in the remaining months of the legislative session. This notwithstanding, we hope that Members will find the updated programme helpful in planning their work ahead.

UPDATED LEGISLATIVE PROGRAMME 2006-07 (March to July 2007)

This updated programme sets out the bills which the Government plans to introduce into the Legislative Council in the remainder of the 2006-07 legislative session. This updated programme may be adjusted in the light of developments.
