### **CLP's Development Fund**

Thank you for your enquiry regarding the way to deal with the balance in CLP's Development Fund (DF) in 2008 in the Panel meeting on Economic Services held on 18 July 2007. Our reply is as follows –

- CLP's DF balance in 2008 will depend on a number of factors including, inter alia, the electricity demand and sales, operating costs, capital investments, measures to control cost and increase in productivity, permitted rate of return and actual basic tariff charged to consumers etc., for the period. The DF will continue to provide funds to ameliorate any tariff increase arising from increase in fuel prices or other factors during the period.
- Regarding the way to deal with the balance in the DF, there are suggestions to return the balance to consumers before the expiry of the current Scheme of Control Agreement (SCA). There are also views suggesting to transfer some balance in the DF to the future 'Tariff Stabilisation Fund' as proposed in the consultation document, which will provide funds, where necessary, to ameliorate the impact of tariff increase on consumers under the new SCA. We will consider the views and discuss with CLP on the way to deal with the balance in the DF.
