Admin 3. The Administration was requested to provide a summary table of the provisions of the Buildings (Amendment) Bill 2007, stipulating offences applicable to building owners/tenants under the legislative framework of the proposed minor works control system and administrative measures imposing or lifting liabilities of building owners/tenants.

#### Admin 4. The Administration undertook to:

- (a) move a Committee Stage amendment (CSA) to empower the Building Authority (BA) to make available building plans in an electronic form via the Internet for public inspection;
- (b) consider amending new sections 4A and 9AA (appointment of registered professionals/registered minor works contractors (RMWCs)) to spell out more clearly under what circumstances a person would be regarded as "the person for whom minor works are to be carried out"; and
- (c) consider if amendments should be made to proposed sections 40(2AC)(b) and 40(2B)(d) in the light of members' concern about formation works, piling works, excavation works or foundation works which were not supposed to be classified as minor works as stated in the provisions.

		(c) Ir Dr Raymond HO expressed concern about the criteria to be adopted to determine whether a minor works "diverges or deviates in any material way from the works shown in a plan relating to minor works that is required to be submitted to the Building Authority", as stipulated in the proposed section 40(2A)(ba). The Administration advised that in enforcing this provision, BD would collect evidence including the material deviation of the minor works per se and whether such deviation would prejudice structural safety, etc. During the course of investigation, BD would take into account all relevant factors to determine

		(e) Ms LI Fung-ying noted with concern that self-employed practitioners might not be aware of the commencement of the proposed minor works control regime but continue to undertake minor works. They would therefore contravene the new section 40(2G). The Administration advised that practitioners had been duly consulted, including via the Minor Works Concern Group, before formulating the current legislative proposal. In addition, extensive publicity would be conducted after passage of the Bill to raise their awareness of the statutory requirements under the proposed minor works control system. To be eligible for undertaking minor works in future, they should apply for registration as RMWCs. Those operating as individuals would be eligible for registration as Class III RMWCs. In addition to the submission of proof of experience or formal qualification for registration, they would be required to attend a one-day top-up course before registration.	the minutes
