### I Confirmation of minutes and matters arising

- Administration's response to issues relating to breath test using pre-screening device raised at the meeting on 20 May 2008 (Second batch))

- 2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>The Bills Committee</u> had examined the need of and justifications for the provision in the existing law for the Police to require a person "having been in charge of" a motor vehicle to provide a specimen of breath for a screening breath test. <u>The Administration</u> explained that this was to cater for certain cases, such as possible evasion of liability by a driver who had run away after a traffic accident and was caught at a later time.
- 4. <u>The Bills Committee</u> had also examined whether a drunk person falling asleep at the rear seat of a vehicle would be prosecuted for drink driving offences. <u>The Administration</u> advised that this would depend on the actual circumstances, for example, whether the vehicle was found on a highway or in a car park. In the former case, it was likely that he would be prosecuted.

- 5. <u>The Administration</u> took members through the proposed Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) (LC Paper No. CB(1)1730/07-08(02). Members did not raise objection to the CSAs proposed by the Administration.
- 6. <u>Mr Andrew CHENG</u> briefed members on his proposed CSAs to lengthen the disqualification period on a first conviction of the offences of drink driving or failure

to provide samples of blood, urine, or breath for testing under the specified circumstances from not less than three months to not less than six months. The draft wordings of the CSAs were set out in LC Paper No. CB(1)1730/07-08(03). Members also noted that Mr Abraham SHEK and Mr KWONG Chi-kin had reservations on Mr CHENG's proposed CSAs. They considered the penalty levels proposed by the Administration appropriate.

7. <u>The Chairman</u> concluded that the Bills Committee had completed examination of the Bill and would report to the House Committee on 13 June 2008, recommending the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill on a date to be determined by the Administration.
