3. The Subcommittee requested the Administration -
  - (a) to provide information on the scope of offences covered by Articles 16(1) and 16(2) and their correlation with Article 3 of the United Nations Convention Against Transnational Organized Crime (UNTOC);
  - (b) to advise whether Article 16(2) was subject to the requirements in Article 16(1);
  - (c) to explain how the requirements of Articles 5, 6, 8 and 23 of UNTOC were implemented in Hong Kong; and
  - (d) to confirm whether the protection of individuals' fundamental rights provided under the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance would be affected following the implementation of UNTOC in Hong Kong.
4. Assistant Legal Adviser 1 was requested to advise on his view, if any, in respect of the information referred to in paragraph 3(a) and (b) to be provided by the Administration.

## **III. Date of next meeting**

5. The Subcommittee agreed that the next meeting might be scheduled, pending the availability of the aforesaid information to be provided by the Administration.
6. The Subcommittee agreed that the Chairman should move a motion at the Council meeting on 21 May 2008 to extend the scrutiny period of the Fugitive Offenders (Transnational Organized Crime) Order to the Council
