CIBSE HKB Comment on

"Ozone Layer Protection Regulation 2009"

- 1. Agreed with the proposals/papers on the implications to ozone depletion and shall establish the regulations for ozone layer protection.
- 2. Our view Global warming is rapidly approaching if not surpassing ozone depletion as a paramount environmental issue.
- Decision based only on consideration of ozone depletion without considering the effect on global warming is not good for our planet.
- 4. Question raised to the SAR Government: "Is the current replacement refrigerant for HCFC the final solution?" It is noted from other developed countries that they are not happy with energy performance of R-134a. While the refrigerant has no ozone depleting potential, it is not energy efficient and will add burden to the problem of global warming.
- 5. Suggest to also explore/reference to Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED), from US Green Building Council, assessment of environmental impact of refrigerant which has a more balanced approach in trying to take both global warming and ozone depletion factors into account.
- 6. We should raise this to our community although it is almost certain HK will have to abide with the phasing out of all HCFC by 2020.
- 7. Suggest the SAR Government to form an expert group to further investigate possible alternative for R-134a.
