Subcommittee on Race Discrimination (Proceedings by Equal Opportunities Commission) Regulation ("the proposed Regulation")

At the meeting of the captioned Subcommittee on 26 March 2009, we were requested by Members to look into whether there are similar anti-discrimination legislation in other common law jurisdictions which we can make reference to in considering the criteria stipulated under the proposed Regulation.

The Equal Opportunities Commission has conducted a research on the anti-discrimination legislation in Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United Kingdom. It was found that no similar legislation in these jurisdictions authorises the bodies concerned to bring proceedings as if it were the victim, when the victim has not done so. It follows that no comparison can be made with these common law jurisdictions.

Separately, I attach the Administration's response to the written views received by the Subcommittee on the proposed Regulation.
