Opinions

In principle, the labeling effect is suggested to be arised from the categorization of CMI and EMI at

schools. Such labeling effect is agreed to be diminished in order to enlarge the CMI student's exposure

to English.

The 'division by class' MOI arrangement is not recommended because the labeling effect on CMI

school is further worsen.

The rising of "Differentiation" at school: Labeling effect and "Differentiation" between classes is

foreseeable at the result of the categorization of CMI and EMI at schools. The mobility of student's

internal form promotion within schools is going to be limited and that may be questioned by the

parents.

Recommendations

Flexibility in using English is going to be enhanced if the teaching at CMI schools is classified 'by

academic discipline' or 'by academic topic'.

It is to be recommended that schools should have the choice in deciding the extent and proportion of

EMI students. Thus, it aids the schools in addressing the problem of individual learning differences

effectively.

The actual data and statistic regarding the English standards of students at schools is suggested not to

be disclosed by The Education Bureau, otherwise, the labeling effect between CMI and EMI schools

and even the "differentiation" between CMI schools are going to be enhanced.
