Proposed by the Administration. 26 June 2009

- 3. Safety of taxi drivers and installation of safety devices in taxis**

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing. In view of the increase in attacks and robberies of taxi drivers, Mr WONG would like to discuss the item as soon as practicable. To facilitate the Panel's discussion, he would also like the Administration to provide an information paper on statistics of criminal cases in this regard, and on the feasibility of installing safety devices in taxis. 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009
- 4. Proposed creation of one permanent Principal Transport Officer post in the Bus and Rail Branch of Transport Department**

Proposed by the Administration. The proposal is to create one permanent Principal Transport Officer post in the Railway Division of the Bus and Railway Branch of the Transport Department to enhance both its planning function in connection with new railways and its monitoring of railway operations. 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009
- 5. MTR Corporation Limited's commitment not to increase fares**

Last discussed at the special Panel meeting on 8 January 2009. Noting that the effective period of MTRCL's commitment not to increase fares would expire in June 2009, members would like to further follow up with MTRCL concerns in this regard nearer the time. Before June 2009

At the meeting on 24 April 2009, members further agreed that to facilitate their consideration of the need to hold a special meeting for discussion of relevant issues, the Administration should be requested to coordinate a written confirmation with MTRCL on whether MTRCL had plans to increase fares after 30 June 2009 and to continue the provision of the East Rail and West Rail Lines Monthly Pass. The Administration's paper in this regard was issued vide LC Paper No. CB(1)1582/08-09 on 14 May 2009.

**6. PWP Item 6579TH - Central – Wan Chai Bypass and Island Eastern Corridor Link**

Proposed by the Administration. Timing of discussion is subject to the objection handling progress of the gazetted amendment road scheme.

**7. Sha Tin New Town, stage 2 - Trunk Road T4**

Proposed by the Administration. The Traffic and Transport Committee of Sha Tin District Council passed a motion requesting Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) to put on hold the project until after the commissioning of Trunk Road T3 and Route 8. Trunk Road T3 and Route 8 (Cheung Sha Wan to Sha Tin) were opened in March 2008. CEDD and the concerned department will examine the actual traffic flow and review the need for the project. Funding application would not be submitted in the 2008-2009 session.

**8. Vehicle maintenance requirements on non-franchised bus operators**

Proposed by Mr LAU Kwong-wah. When the Panel discussed "Enhancement of the safety of long downhill roads" at the meeting on 30 June 2008, Mr LAU stressed the need to ensure the vehicle examination frequency of non-franchised bus operators was comparable to that of franchised buses. He requested the Administration to follow up the vehicle maintenance requirements on non-franchised bus operators, and report back on the developments in the 2008-2009 legislative session.

**9. Operation of outlying island ferry services**

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing and Mr IP Wai-ming at the meeting on 14 October 2008. In consideration of the great difficulty in operating outlying island ferry services due to high fuel cost and shrinking island populations, the members saw a need to follow up measures to tackle the difficulties, so as to enhance the financial viability of the services while keeping fare and service levels reasonable.

At the meeting between Duty Roster Members and 三島聯盟 on 3 March 2009, views about the policy on outlying island ferry services were expressed. The memo from the Complaints Division referring relevant issues to the Panel for consideration was issued vide LC Paper No. CB(1) 1075/08-09 on 17 March 2009.

**10. Safety of reversing goods vehicle**

Proposed by Mr Andrew CHENG. Last discussed at the meetings on 24 October 2006 and 25 May 2007. Mr CHENG would like to follow up progress in this regard after the two meetings.

**11. Regulation of cargo compartments casually placed at roadsides**

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing. He was concerned about the safety risks caused by cargo compartments for storing construction wastes casually placed at roadsides. He took the view that proper enforcement actions and legislative measures should be put in place to ensure that the contractors concerned would install flashlights, lighting systems or other appropriate devices, so that at night or under poor lighting conditions, motorists could be made aware of such compartments being placed at roadsides in order to ensure road safety.

**12. Exemption from regulation 53(2) of the Road Traffic (Traffic Control) Regulations (Cap. 374 sub. leg. G) for vehicles used for canvassing activities**

At the Subcommittee to Study Four Items of Subsidiary Legislation under the Road Traffic Ordinance, some members of the Subcommittee considered that the Administration should take a broader view and the proposed Amendment Regulations should aim at facilitating not only the float parades to be held at the Hong Kong Disneyland but also canvassing activities during elections. The Administration was of the view that the safety requirements for standing passengers on such vehicles went beyond the ambit of the then legislative amendments, but the Administration undertook to separately examine this proposal in detail.
