Updated Legislative Programme 2009-10 (March to July 2010)

This updated programme sets out the bills which the Government plans to introduce into the Legislative Council in the remainder of the 2009-10 legislative session. The bills to be introduced are subject to change in the light of the state of readiness of the bills and changing circumstances.

1.	Communications Authority Bill	• To establish the Communications Authority (CA) as the unified regulator for the electronic communications sector. The Telecommunications Authority and the Broadcasting Authority will be merged to become the CA.	CEDB
2.	Competition Bill	• To establish a statutory framework for regulating anti-competitive conduct, with a view to promoting free and healthy competition in Hong Kong to the benefit of the economy and consumers.	CEDB
3.	Legal Practitioners (Amendment) Bill	• To introduce limited liability partnerships (LLP) for solicitors' practice in Hong Kong. LLP is a model for doing business which confers limited liability on innocent partners so as to insulate their personal assets from claims incurred by negligence of other partners.	DoJ
