

key points we've raised are

- 1) Whatever system is chosen must be simplest, cost effective and entail least administrative costs
- 2) The preferred option for this is collection at POS
- 3) There needs to be progressive charge and collection of the WEEE charge for existing products
- 4) There needs to be an immediate charge for new WEEE products
- 5) The scope of WEEE products needs to be expanded to include normal household electrical products
- 6) Products should be sorted into bands/types (say 5) and a fixed fee based on these bands
- 7) Overall there should be innovation allowed in the system
- 8) The problems will be in the logistics not the treatment
- 9) Licensing should be implemented for contractors with strict EHS controls that are fully implemented to ensure level playing field
