2. Regulation and control of pharmaceutical products in Hong Kong	31 March 2009	<p>The Administration was requested to provide the revised checklist used by the inspectors of the Department of Health when conducting inspections on pharmaceutical manufacturers once they were finalised.</p>	<p>The Administration updated the Panel vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2139/08-09(01), which was issued to members on 7 July 2009, that the revised inspection checklist would be available after the completion of the Good Manufacturing Practices consultancy study on local manufacturers and the subsequent adoption of the consultancy recommendations by the Review Committee on Regulation of Pharmaceutical Products.</p>

Interim review outcome of pilot Doctor Work Reform programmes	11 May 2009	The Administration was requested to provide information on the average number of public hospital medical and nursing staff on each night shift and the average weekly work hours of public hospital doctors at different ranks.	The Administration's response was issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2198/08-09(01) on 13 July 2009. The Hospital Authority (HA) has started monitoring doctors' working hours from January 2009. The work hour data of HA doctors will be available by end of the third quarter of 2009.

Implementation of the seasonal influenza and pneumococcal vaccinations	9 November 2009	The Administration was requested to provide a response in writing on the suggestion of including primary and secondary students in the human swine influenza vaccination programme after consulting the Scientific Committees of the Centre for Health Protection.	The Administration will provide a written response in due course.

Mechanism for handling medical incidents in public and private hospitals	9 November 2009	<p>The Administration was requested to provide the following information in writing -</p> <p>(a) the number of sentinel events reported in public hospitals from 1 October 2007 to 30 September 2009, with a breakdown by category, to show the trend of reporting;</p> <p>(b) a summary of the disciplinary actions taken by HA against the staff involved in the sentinel events since 1 October 2007; and</p>	The Administration will provide a written response in due course.

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		(c) a summary of sentinel events occurred in private hospitals since 1 February 2007 which were caused by system factor and recommendations from the Department of Health on how the related services should be improved.
