
**Panel on Welfare Services**  
**Subcommittee on Poverty Alleviation**

At the meeting of the Subcommittee on Poverty Alleviation held on 21 January 2010, Members requested the Administration to (a) provide details on local community economic activities promoted by District Officers (DOs) in collaboration with District Councils (DCs) in Yuen Long and North Districts; and (b) revert to the Subcommittee on the proposal of establishing hawker bazaars at designated locations in the less well-off districts. The Subcommittee also discussed the proposal of setting up a morning bazaar in Tin Shui Wai at its meeting on 31 March 2010.

In this regard, we set out the details of local community economic activities promoted by DOs in collaboration with DCs in Yuen Long and North Districts in the past three years at Annex. On the proposal of establishing hawker bazaars at designated locations in the less well-off districts, we have consulted the Food and Health Bureau (FHB). FHB indicated that in recent years, members of the public had proposed, from time to time, the establishment of open-air bazaars rich in local characteristics at suitable sites. FHB is open-minded to such proposals and stands ready to provide, in collaboration with relevant departments, appropriate assistance to the proponents if they have identified suitable sites with the support of the relevant DCs, and have satisfied with the requirements on food and environmental hygiene.

As regards the proposal to set up a morning bazaar in Tin Shui Wai, DO(Yuen Long) together with the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department have been following up the matter with the relevant parties. Meetings amongst Hon WONG Kwok-hing, Yuen Long DC Members, a group of Tin Shui Wai hawkers and representatives of government departments concerned were held on 11 February and 1 April 2010 to work out a viable proposal for the proposed morning bazaar, including such details as the location and management arrangement. The Administration will call another meeting at appropriate time to follow-up on the matter.
