Re: Initial Proposals to Combat Drug Driving

We refer to your letter dated 27 July 2010 seeking our views on the captioned. To gauge the opinion of the medical profession towards such an important bill, Hong Kong Doctors Union conducted a survey among our members and the results are tabulated as follows. (Please see enclosed results of survey for details).

- 1. The majority agreed that it is appropriate to putting a list of most common drugs of abuse in Hong Kong i.e. heroin, ketamine, ice, cannabis, cocaine and MDMA to be covered in the proposed "zero-tolerance control" legislation.
- 2. The majority disagreed with the proposal to make it an offence to drive under the influence of drugs e.g. anti-hypertensives and anti-diabetic agents.
- 3. The majority agreed that it would be an offence to drive when impaired by drugs.
- 4. Regarding measures to enhance patients' awareness on effects of drugs on driving the majority agreed on oral or with using written medical advice on labels accompanying drugs given by doctors, dentists or pharmacists.
- 5. The great majority believed the Government should educate the public not to drive whenever they have adverse influence from drugs.
- 6. The majority agreed to empower trained Police officers to require a driver to undergo preliminary impairment tests (including Pupil Measure test, Romberg test, the Walk and Turn test, the One Leg Stand test and the Finger to Nose test) if the Police have reasonable cause to believe that the driver is suspected to be impaired by drugs.
